## Animal Health (Bird Diseases) (Jersey) Order 2017

### Application for Importation of Poultry to Jersey (From GB and CI's)

A person importing poultry or any eggs intended for hatching under the Animal Health (Bird Diseases) (Jersey) Order 2017, article 3 must be in possession of a licence granted by the Minister or a person appointed by the Minister to import into Jersey.

You are advised to check with your supplier that they are not under any restriction by the competent authority for any diseases.

An officer may, refuse an application and by notice in writing, vary, revoke or suspend any import licence issued.

Please allow at least 10 working days for processing.

### Conditions of the import (the import licence will have the full set of conditions)

The Importer shall comply with the following conditions and any others included in any licence issued to import:

1. The animal health and welfare section of the department must be notified in writing, of the exact date and time of import\* at least 24 hours prior to arrival. The notification form should be emailed to [Pets@gov.ie](mailto:Pets@gov.ie) If the arrival time changes after notification the duty officer can be contacted out of office hours on 01534 441617.
2. In accordance with Council Directive 2005/94/EC if disease has been confirmed no poultry can be imported from a Protection Zone (PZ) of 3 km and Surveillance Zone (SZ) of 10 km.
3. After importation, the birds must be kept at the destination declared in the notification sent to the department and custody of the bird(s) must not be transferred within **30 Days** after importation.
4. All imported birds must be housed for a minimum of **30 days** on arrival.
5. Except when prior written approval has been given by the States Veterinary Officer no movements of any live poultry off the premises is permitted during the **30 days** after importation.
6. Good biosecurity must be practiced at all times to protect your birds including isolating new stock from other birds for a minimum of 30 days. Ensure good hygiene practices are in place so that the risk of disease occurring or spreading is minimised.
7. The licensee must ensure that person moving anything under the authority of this licence shall before leaving the premises of origin
  - The exterior of the vehicle must be free of any visible contamination with mud, slurry, animal faeces, excretions or any other similar matter
  - the vehicle's wheels, wheel arches and mud flaps must be cleansed and disinfected after loading and before leaving. The cleansing and disinfection, using a Defra approved disinfectant, must take place at a point which no contamination with bird feathers, faeces, litter, egg shell or any similar matter can take place
  - Any crates or boxes must be clean and disinfected prior to loading.
8. After unloading at the premises of destination;
  - the parts of the vehicle and any equipment used to transport anything which might be contaminated with mud, slurry, animal faeces, excretions or any other similar matter must be cleansed and disinfection using a Defra approved disinfectant, on site.
  - The vehicle's wheels, wheel arches and mud flaps must be cleansed and disinfected after unloading and before leaving.
  - Any crates or boxes must be clean and disinfected prior to loading.
9. Any vehicle used in the transport of the birds should be unloaded at the point of destination as close to the entrance of the premises as possible and ideally on a clean hard standing surface so as to minimise the risk of contamination with mud, slurry, animal faeces, excretions or any other similar matter.
10. If for any reason this licence is not within its validity period from the date of issue, it should be returned to the Department.
11. All expenses incurred with this importation must be met by the importer.
