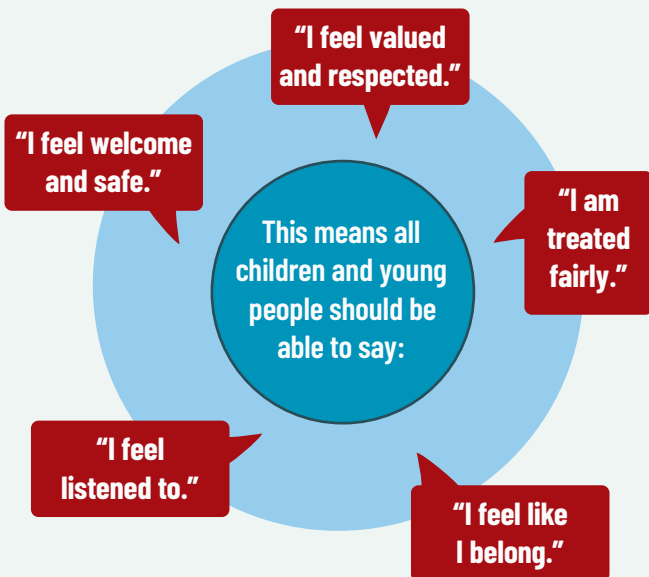


The Government of Jersey wants all children and young people to have the best care and education, from early years through to adulthood.

We want all children and young people to feel welcomed, included, and supported in their education.



Inclusive Education Principles

1 Children's Voice

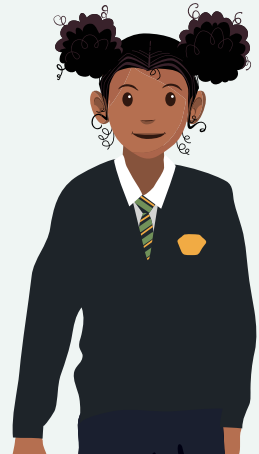
All children and young people have a say in decisions and their opinions are listened to and valued.

In nursery, school or college you can say:

I have lots of opportunities to share my opinions.

I am listened to, and my views are used to help make plans and decisions.

I get help and the support I need to ensure I'm heard.



2 Respected and Valued

All children and young people feel respected and valued.

In nursery, school or college you can say:

My teachers help me build my confidence and I feel like I can be me.

I'm proud of my language and culture and I respect different cultures too.

We learn to treat everyone equally and stand up against unfairness.



3 Safe Environment

All children and young people feel safe and confident in their learning spaces.

In nursery, school or college you can say:

I have a quiet place to help me learn and feel safe.

I have special tools to help me with my learning.

All spaces in my school are safe and welcoming.



4 Wellbeing and Support

The needs and wellbeing of all children and young people are noticed and taken care of.

In nursery, school or college you can say:

I feel safe and can talk to people about my life and get support.

I learn about wellbeing so I know where and how to get help if I need it.

When I have a problem going on in my life, I feel supported by people around me.



5 Learning

All children and young people get support to learn in ways that meet their needs.

In nursery, school or college you can say:

I can talk to my teachers if I have a problem with my learning and get help and support.

I have lots of opportunities to learn in fun and interesting ways.

I have help to reach my goals and my achievements are celebrated.



6 Working Together

Everyone works together to make sure all children and young people have the right care and support.

In nursery, school or college you can say:

My family's ideas are listened to when decisions are being made.

My teachers talk with my family so they know how I'm doing and what support I'm getting.

My family gets the right advice and help when they need it.



7 Leadership and Responsibility

Leaders show everyone how to be inclusive and lead by example.

In nursery, school or college you can say:

All the staff know how to make sure we all feel included and happy.

All staff include everyone and make sure they are part of everything.

My school invites people to share their ideas so we can learn from others.
