







PLAN scale 1:500

Key to hard surface treatments

-  Pedestrian surfaces within the lodge area in cement stabilised hoggin
-  Pedestrian areas within the car park in brown bitmac
-  Vehicular areas in Terram BodPave 40 or similar porous mesh reinforced gravel surface
-  Access point for vehicles reinforced with granite cobbles

Key to landscape layers

areas managed as lawns / social spaces - these are the main private leisure areas associated with each lodge. Mown grass in car parking areas is kept short to help with visibility and security.

areas managed as species rich grassland - these buffer zones between the private spaces are to be managed in a way that attracts wildlife into the site as well as creating a relaxed informal play space. These areas are mown once a year in September

areas of structural planting where native species shrubs are used to screen off individual lodges and provide shelter and privacy. They will also create excellent habitat and food sources for a wide range of birds, insects and animals.

tree planting and 1m tall 'banques' (dark green lines) used to create a central wildlife corridor across the site from north to south and to provide shelter to the lodges while allowing sunlight from the south, west and north west to reach the patio areas
