Consultation Draft - October 2023

The vision of the Jersey Marine Spatial Plan (JMSP) is for a thriving marine environment providing environmental, economic, cultural and social benefits. It was proposed in the 2022 Bridging Island Plan, and has four key purposes:

1. To provide a framework for organising human and marine resources and activities in Jersey's territorial waters.
2. To develop a network of Marine Protected Areas.
3. To inform the policies of the next iteration of the Island Plan.
4. To support co-ordinated development and decision-making on all aspects affecting the marine environment.

The Marine Spatial Plan will help Jersey to fulfil its international obligations, such as the 2022 Kunming-Montreal Global Biodiversity Framework, which requires 30% of the environment to be protected by 2030. It will also contribute to efforts to address the climate and biodiversity crises; help to promote sustainable fishing practices; reduce conflicts between different users of the marine environment, and increase resilience of services and infrastructure.

This map lists the Priorities that are described in the Marine Spatial Plan and shows many important locations and zones. The map key includes Priorities that are not mapped to provide a quick reference.
