Formation of a sub - committee in relation to medicinal cannabis

I write to request your expertise and assistance in joining a sub-committee of the Advisory Council on the Misuse of Drugs. Participation in the sub-committee is not a long-term commitment and will be disbanded once the purpose is fulfilled. Once initiated the sub-committee will meet fortnightly at first, moving to monthly as progress is made. The sub-committee will provide regular progress updates to the Advisory Council on the Misuse of Drugs. The purpose of this sub-committee will be aiding the further development of a medicinal cannabis consensus statement with guidance to public, professionals, and workplaces. Good progress has already been made by Public Health Policy Officers with support from a small number of key individuals. An initial draft consensus statement has been attached to this e-mail for your information. However, your knowledge and skills would be greatly appreciated in helping to resolve several outstanding issues linked to this work. These issues touch upon the following themes:

- Lack of regulation regarding both cannabis clinics and prescribers
- Problems where existing policies are not considered sufficient for the prescribing and appropriate use of medicinal cannabis
- Gaps in government policy, which in turn results in a lack of clear advice or guidance to external stakeholders and workplaces

This work will also consider implications around improving health, reducing harm, protecting at-risk groups, reducing inequalities, and addressing Human Rights concerns. Some of the above may already have touched on your, or your departments area of work.

Purpose of sub-committee



Further develop a consensus statement on CBPMs.

By:

- 1. Clarifying and prioritising outstanding issues with CBPMs
- 2. Resolving issues through the statement and additional guidance
- 3. Highlighting any other options or recommendations to feed back to ACMD
- Once an issue is clarified only a few short sentences are needed to resolve.
- If an issue requires further work to resolve this would be recorded and fed back to ACMD

Purpose of consensus statement and guidance



A comprehensive public statement to reflect a unified Government stance which:

- Defines different types of medical and non-medical cannabis based products
- Briefly summarise evidence and recommendations on the use of CBPMs
- Includes and signposts to high level guidance to prescribers, other professionals, patients, and workplaces

Other work is needed in this area to complete and simplify table. Although these basic definitions are workable there are other complexities depending on circumstances:

- Possession of licensed medicine without valid prescription is illegal, content and ratios within CBD oils could be illegal.
- <u>Unlicenced CBPMs</u> can be prescribed by any prescriber privately at cost to patient and available from a number of pharmacies
- Licensed CBPMs typically fall within (hospital) specialists, are government funded, and only available from Hospital Pharmacy

2. Briefly summarise evidence and recommendations on the use of CBMPs



Benefits

- Demonstrated with licensed medicines only, for three conditions, not pain
- Limited but growing evidence of 'clinically meaningful benefits' to some patients and conditions with unlicensed or off-label use

Risk and harms

- All forms of cannabis and CBMPs 'have potential to cause side effects and harms'
- List of known risks and harms (perhaps condense to most relevant locally)

Limitations

- Limitations should be discussed with and understood by patient
- Potential lack of safety and efficacy when treating specific conditions when using licensed medicines off-label or unlicensed medicines
- This includes dosage, side effects, lack of patient information leaflets

3. To offer practical guidance to prescribers, other professionals, patients, and workplaces



Prescribers

- Circumstances in which should not be prescribed (pregnant, breastfeeding, psychosis risk, under 18, as first-line defence, pain?)
- Explain limitations of evidence, check can afford fees, regular monitoring

Other professionals

- Non-prescribers not to recommend supplements
- Concerns to be raised to prescriber not A&D Service as a referral

New problems



- As work has progressed more concerns or issues have been raised
- Many fall outside scope and remit of Public Health
- The importance or impact of concerns and issues are not fully understood

Steps to in committee debate

Watchdog for medical cannabis clinics petition (end 24 Nov 23) - Medicinal cannabis clinics have opened in Jersey and offer varying services and inconsistent pricing. Jersey needs a watchdog in relation to these clinics to ensure that residents are receiving optimal care - v. low number of signatures



Substance use strategy (published XXX): Continue progression away from criminalisation by reviewing and adopting specific policy options that fall under decriminalisation and legalisation aims. This will include ensuring alignment to existing government commitments on improving health and protecting children

MHSS to Health Scruntiny: I have responsibility for the Misuse of Drugs Law and so it would be appropriate to be involved in the in-committee debate.

JHA to Scrunity (July 2023): As I said over a year ago, my intention is to have an in-committee debate about decriminalisation. It should not be in the too-difficult tray. We need to have a conversation about that and we need to understand the mood of the Assembly to understand to what extent we decriminalise, if at all
