Additionally, our QA Manager asked a question of the USDA, regarding milk shipment and received the following reply: Shipments of milk/milk products exported from foot-and-mouth disease free regions (UK) accompanied by an export veterinary health certificate signed by an official veterinarian can be imported into the US without an import permit if the language below is certified to: "The milk/milk product was processed in (name of the country) a region listed in 9 CFR 94.1(a)(2) from milk produced in (name of the country) a region listed in 9 CFR 94.1(a)(2) as free of foot-and-mouth disease. The milk/milk product has never been in any region where foot-and-mouth disease exists except when moving under seal as described in 9 CFR 94.16(c)." I apologize for the delay. In response to your questions:

Could you possibly use a combination of blue and dry ice? If you freeze the samples and then ship with blue ice, along with dry ice, the samples should stay cooled. During transport the thawing blue ice could buy some extra time...

And, yes, we do analyze serum for PFAS. Any blood sample would have to clot and be spun prior to decanting and freezing. Once frozen it should be no different than the milk/potato sample(s). Please find our serum prep instructions attached. With whatever tubes the specimen is shipped in, it wouldn't be a bad idea to include a couple extra empty tubes in case our lab needs to profile them. Red top tubes, if they aren't as universal as we think they are, have no coagulant.

Please also find attached Vista's serum test order form, for your use. We can analyze for additional PFAS, not noted on the Serum Test Order form. Which are you interested in? PFOS only?

Regarding the below email chain I wanted to clarify the state and condition the samples will need to arrive in (I will likely be sending them). I am currently awaiting a response from our couriers as to how long the samples will take to get to you (likely 2-3 days customs depending), however in the meantime;

- It will likely take several days at a minimum for transportation of the samples. Regarding the milk samples do these need to be refrigerated/ cooled for transport? I'm not sure how souring or solidifying of the sample in transit would impact the testing
- 2. Can your laboratory also test blood samples for PFAs? If so
 - a. What samples quantity would be required
 - b. How would they need to be transported (refrigerated etc)?
