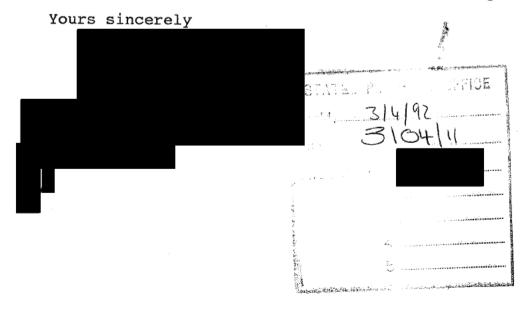
HAUT DU MONT FARM, ST PETER

Thank you for your letter of the 23rd March, the contents of which I have noted.

I was already aware that this property had been identified as a site of special interest since a letter had already been sent to the previous owner.

I am fully aware of the implications of the listing but thank you nevertheless for having drawn our attention to them.

I was very surprised to learn that it is not your normal policy to make appointments prior to going on to private property and even more surprised to learn that having ventured on to private land without due notice, you do not even carry any form of identification to confirm who and what you are. Might it not be sensible for the various planning officers to be given some form of identity card so that if they do have to make unexpected visits to private land, at least the owners can have some form of assurance that you do not have any evil intent.

I did receive your letter dated June 4, 1990, and I apologise for not having acknowledged it sooner.

In answer to your last paragraph, I know of no other persons, apart from the Public Services Committee as lessors of the land adjacent to the tower, who have an interest in either the tower or the neighbouring land.

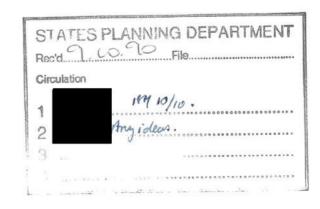
We have had a problem with the tower in that for the past two years it has been occupied by a number of birds, believed to be doves. We have removed a number of dead birds and together with the droppings of the remaining birds the inside of the tower has become somewhat unpleasant.

As this building is now acknowledged as being of "aesthetic and historical value", perhaps your department could assist our club in keeping the inside of the tower as aesthetically pleasing as the outside. I have noticed that the tower at First Tower has had the apertures bricked up, but this does not look particularly attractive and I would imagine that your department would not approve of this action at Beaumont Tower. Perhaps some grillwork attached from the inside would have the desired effect, and I should be grateful for any suggestions that you may have together with a recommendation that Public Services should carry out the necessary work to prevent any further deterioration of the internal "decoration".

Please let me know if you require keys for access to carry out an inspection.

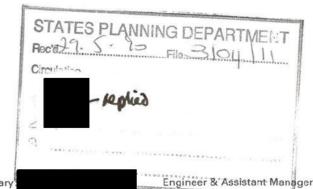
Listed Buildings - Tesson Mill, St. Peter's Valley

Further to the letter recently submitted on this Company's behalf by I should like to elaborate on the subject.

Over the past fifteen or so years, the Company has considered several schemes connected with the development of Tesson Mill. Mainly they have been concerned with the development of living accommodation for Company employees together with a proper use of part of the building for storage. All the schemes have foundered because of the cost of trying to retain the frontage of the Mill in its present form. Having been built as a Mill, the floor heights are erractic and the window spacings very odd and this together with the considerable cost of solving the flooding problem that was mentioned in letter have always lead to the abandonment of any scheme and the Mill is now used as storage for building materials. The maintaining of the shell of the building in its present form will place a heavy burden on the Company by way of maintenance of the structure which we may well only be able to use for material storage.
