WET MEADOWS WETLANDS OF NATURE CONSERVATION VALUE

First of all, many thanks for finding time to come to the meeting on Tuesday, and for your helpful comments both during it and afterwards.

You told me on the phone yesterday about the increase in grants for drainage improvement and asked for more information about wet meadow sites of particular value for nature conservation. I have attached a list of sites (by parish, and with field numbers) which are likely to be put forward for SSI designation. Your assistance in helping to protect these sites from adverse effects of drainage would be very much welcomed and this seems an ideal opportunity to begin the informal liaison and consultation process we all spoke about on Tuesday. We can provide more detailed information about these sites if, and when you need it. If you contact [REDACTED] or myself we will do all we can to help.

These sites are the most important ones, but by separating them out we would not wish it to be thought that other meadow areas are of no value at all. There are a number of sites of lesser significance which nevertheless do have value and where we would welcome the opportunity for informal consultation. In addition there is the difficult question of fields surrounding the proposed SSI's whose drainage would have an indirect effect on the SSI sites themselves because they are hydrologically related.

It is a rather longer task to sort these out and identify the field numbers, so could I leave it that we will contact you separately about these, at which time we can discuss the best way to deal with them? In the meantime you have the priority ones for immediate reference.

Please let us know if you have any queries on the list.
