Hi John,

My understanding of the plan is that Public Health will receive the requests and those who are referred by GP's will cross checked against the general area of the historic plume by myself and limited. I don't think Public Health expect lots of enquiries given the pre-requisite of a GP referral as part of the eligibility criteria, but we shall see. I don't know the answer to your second question, but would suggest that it would be proactive to test those that may fall in an area that potentially may be defined as a secondary plume once the hydrogeological survey is complete, and I will be advising Public Health accordingly on any I am asked to comment upon.

I agree, and all these points have been made. All GPs are to be briefed. It is not even known what a "safe" level is.

The only trial ongoing at present to remove the chemical involves giving blood every 12 weeks or plasma every 6 weeks and discarding it. The theory is that the body will produce clean blood, so dieting whatever levels there are.
