## Do not bring banned dogs

We can seize any dog on the banned list or dogs showing characteristics represented by those on the banned list.

## Types of banned dog

It's illegal to bring certain types of dog into Jersey. We will seize any dog on the banned list or if the dog showing characteristics represented by those on the banned list.

Dogs on the banned list are types rather than breeds because they are not recognised breeds by the <u>Kennel Club</u>.

Banned dogs include any dog of the type commonly known as the:

- Dogo Argentino
- Fila Brasileiro (Brazilian Mastiff)
- Japanese Tosa (or Tosa)
- Pit Bull Terrier

It also includes any other type which appears to have been bred for fighting.

The following are commonly known as Pit Bull Terriers. You should seek advice before importing them into Jersey:

This includes any other type of dog showing characteristics to those bred for fighting. The following is a <u>non-exhaustive</u> list of popular dog breeds portraying characteristic of fighting dogs:

- American Staffordshire Terriers (Am Staffs or AST's)
- American Bulldogs, including XL Bulldogs or Bully's Bullies
- Presa Canario
- Irish Staffordshire Bull Terrier (not to be confused with a Staffordshire Bull Terrier)
- Old Fashioned Staffords (not to be confused with a Staffordshire Bull Terrier)
- Traditional Staffords (not to be confused with a Staffordshire Bull Terrier)
- Wolf hybrids
- Certain Shepherd dogs (Caucasian, Central Asian, Kangal & Yugoslavian Shepherds)
- Certain Mastiffs (Neapolitan, Spanish and Boerboel Mastiffs)
- Cane Corso
