Hi

Whilst some of the reasoning comes across somewhat sensationalised, proximation and excessive shading might be more palatable language.

Looking at the photographs and canopy form, the subject trees may well have been previously managed as pollards, although without viewing them up close I cannot say for certain.

The species will normally tolerate pollarding and cyclical pollarding and therefore any initial visual harm caused by allowing the works will be temporary. Furthermore, if consent it granted for any development this may block aspects of the view of the trees and reduce their amenity in the wider landscape.

In conclusion, whilst they make a positive contribution to the character and appearance of the area and are a useful screen, the potential harm to the tree(s) is moderate and within their ability to tolerate the work without unduly impacting their health. If they have been previously pollarded, the fact that any management may have lapsed would not be a single robust reason to refuse the work. Works to alleviate excessive shading and encroachment are reasonable but also subjective by individual assessment.

In the absence of any neighbouring objections, other than their importance for wider visual screening the proposal would seem reasonable and justified.


I've received some information back from the applicant regarding the pollarding of the 2no Holm Oaks at St Brelades.

Rationale - the Holm Oaks in question dominate our adjoining neighbor's garden, plunging into darkness in the afternoon and by way of lack of sunlight killed part of the lawn, while causing problems for the local habitat within both our properties. The branches grossly overhang our neighbour's property, La Plage, with the branches causing damage to the property's fencing.

These trees are already pollards and for the health of these trees which are reportedly not good specimens, pollarding management is necessary. In addition, as previously mentioned, these works will benefit our neighbour to the east (La Plage) as these trees block out afternoon / evening light from the property.

Works - by AAA Tree Services - the tree limbs will be cut with care back to the trunk at the height of previous pollard cuts, circa 2 mtrs above the ground. These works would be undertaken between Oct and Feb inclusive to avoid the bird nesting season.

Maintenance - intended to pollard the trees every 5-10 years depending on growth.



I would be grateful for your review of this proposal. I recall you mentioned restoring a previously pollarded tree can be a sound approach. As previously discussed I am concerned the screen and green backdrop afforded by the trees would be completely lost and so am interested to know if a phased approach to the works would be reasonable.


