



B. Business Arising



2. States Members briefing (ALL)

- noted that at the last Steering Group meeting the 23rd September was the confirmed date for a States Members briefing this has now been moved to 18th November.
- explained that part of this event will be a video showing States Members the background to cannabis production in Jersey: what industry looks like and how Government regulates and supports it. will be asking a number of people in this group to review the script and give views on what should be amended / included. A couple of officers will also be approached for interview.

5. Environmental Impact Assessments (ALL)

Assessments (EIA)s are a requirement of new developments and as such are laid down in an Order under the Planning and Building Law. Questions have been raised at previous meetings as to whether the cannabis industry should be subject to EIAs.

spoke to the Group at the last meeting, expressing view. In summary, growing produce does not require an EIA, processing quite often does. The Health Minister wants EIAs applied to the processing elements. suggested a discussion was had on making bodies statutory consultees to the Health Minister.

A.O.B. (ALL)

- stated that the Minister for Treasury and Resources has lodged the Tax Regulations which are fairly limited in scope. Tax had hoped that the Regulations would be broader and future proofed but have acknowledged that the Minister will possibly revisit the scope of the Regulations next year.
- A smaller working group possibly involving the economy and scientific officers of this Group needs to be formed.
- The debate will be in November just after the States Members briefing. is putting together a briefing pack and will circulate a Q&A document to this Group in case non-tax questions are put to the Minister.
