

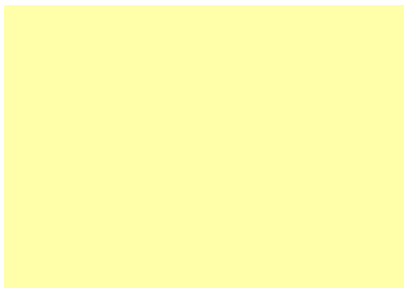

Re: Your second trimester screening result

You recently had the quadruple test to screen for Down s syndrome. This has shown that your baby has a lower chance of having this condition. Your individual chances for this pregnancy are as follows:

Down s syndrome 1 chance in
Edward s syndrome 1 chance in

For example: to help you understand what this means imagine a group of the above number of women. One woman will be pregnant with a baby that is affected by a chromosomal syndrome.
We do not offer further testing at this level. A lower chance result does not mean that there is no chance at all that the baby has Down s, Edwards; or Patau s syndrome, just that it is unlikely.
