## Purpose of the Report

To seek the Minister's approval for the installation of a traffic signal-controlled pedestrian crossing along La Grande Route de St. Martin, Maufant Village adjacent to the Community Centre.

The project will also explore the feasibility of rationalising the existing southbound bus stops at the northern end of Maufant Village into a single bus stop and waiting shelter by the junction of La Grande Route de St. Martin and Les Parquets. (*Poplar Avenue* (3569) & *Maufant Village* (3295))

### **Background**

Through the Road Safety Review Panel, requests have been received for a safer pedestrian crossing point across La Grande Route de St. Martin in Maufant Village to facilitate pedestrian access to the Co-Op Locale Maufant and Community Centre.

An options study for a pedestrian crossing across La Grande Route de St. Martin with the objective of providing a safer and more attractive walking route has been undertaken to determine the feasible options. The outcome being a traffic signal-controlled pedestrian crossing being the preferred option.

Infrastructure and Environment have also received multiple public requests for improved waiting facilities for the *Poplar Avenue* (3569) bus stop to the north of Maufant Village.

#### **Discussion**

The proposed traffic signal-controlled pedestrian crossing and bus shelter will be located on land already in Public ownership, and therefore no formal land acquisition will be required.

The Parish of St. Saviour's Roads Committee have been briefed on the pedestrian crossing proposal and have given their support. Jersey Property Holdings, who are landlords of the Youth Centre site, and the Variety Club / CYPES who reside in the building have also been briefed on the project.

The Infrastructure and Environment Transport team plan to undertake a targeted consultation with adjacent residents and businesses who would be directly affected by the construction of the pedestrian crossing.

The construction of a traffic signal-controlled pedestrian crossing and bus shelter (if applicable) is deemed to be permitted development by the Regulation Directorate, which enables the Minister for Infrastructure to approve the works in accordance with the Planning and Building (General Development) (Jersey) Order 2011, Schedule 1, Part 6.

#### **Recommendation**

In accordance with the Road Traffic (Pedestrian Crossings) (Jersey) Order 1982, The Minister is recommended to approve the installation of a traffic signal-controlled pedestrian crossing and all associated accommodation works as above.


### Reason(s) for Decision

The project budget is £150,000 and will be funded by Car Park Trading Fund.


