We discussed yesterday at the SCG the need for coordination of PPE requests, the cell HCS have set up to manage requests and we must follow that procedure. The TCG will coordinate all requests and work with the HCS cell.

The reference to cloth PPE is a way of accessing more PPE and these will be made by firms, not by your staff.

I would ask please you keep your staff in an informed place re the MOH advice, as all your staff do not need PPE and don't need to use it all the time. Other services are having similar conversations with their staff and we need to be measured in our approach. We are doing everything we can to secure more PPE.

You will no doubt continue to manage the prison as we discussed on a call yesterday to mitigate the risks and early prevention measures will assist that in increasing the distancing, longer hours in cells etc, again as we discussed.

Julian- please see the notes below and the response from To be advised to make home-made / DIY masks to prevent C19 infection for prison officers, when 20,000 face masks are now here and more coming, does not seem to address the matter seriously, nor provide a defensible position to ensure the safety and well-being of staff, or prisoners and especially if some die from C19. We must all have done what we can to prevent this and deaths amongst the wider population, that could be caused by prisoner infections impacting adversely on ICU capacity at a critical time.

I assume you understand what we are trying to achieve and its covered in the notes to below. In summary - we are trying to ensure we prevent C19 infection for as long as possible from entering the prison, and when it does to slow down the infection rate, and keep our most vulnerable prisoners from becoming unwell and blocking ICU beds at a critical peak of infection for the Island as a whole. When we now have 20,000 masks and more coming, to be told to make DIY masks does not seem to recognise this strategy nor provide the protection we need to give to our staff in SoJPS, who deal with prisoners at close proximity every day. After HCS colleagues we probably have the greatest exposure to C19 risks of any other service. We don't have the luxury of social distancing in all we do by the nature a prison. We have taken many measures to protect, distance and isolate, however appropriate PPE is now the next step to Protect, Prevent and Delay. We cant wait for C19 to become widespread in the prison before deploying PPE. It may then be too late to avoid unnecessary infections amongst staff and prisoners, and may lead to avoidable deaths.

The message that we are having to use DIY masks may also lead to prisoners taking the matter to the media or their lawyers for failing to provide adequate protection. The JPSA may also react and could take this to the media or other politicians as they have done before. Some of their members have been asking when will they be issued PPE? To date we have informed them we don't have sufficient PPE on the Island, and are waiting for it to arrive, and we are not at the point of needing it. I now think we have sufficient PPE and with the rapid increase in C19 positive rate and with the anticipated peak in April, we should now deploy widely in the prison for all the reasons outlined. Its not about preferential treatment but recognising risks in the prison which are quite unique, and how we could impact on JGH ICU capacity if we don't get this right.

Your assistance to ensure we have appropriate PPE at the correct time its needed, will be appreciated. We now have sufficient PPE on the Island with more coming and to delay issuing to SoJPS staff seems to be high risk, from many angles. Most importantly, once infected in the prison, it will most likely rapidly spread despite our best efforts, and we may impact on ICU capacity at the peak of infection on the Island, which may cost the lives of ordinary citizens let alone prisoners.

Please be assured we are doing all the things you suggest and many more. We do however wish to avoid the prison having a large number of prisoners unwell, and as we all know the prison is unrepresentative of the wider population with a high number of prisoners who are older and / or have significant ULH Conditions.

If C19 enters the prison, given the age and ULH Conditions of up to prisoner, we could rapidly overwhelm the hospital with acute cases. Our aim is to avoid this at all costs- hence all the measures we have taken to prevent, protect and delay. And now suggesting some more that may delay longer, and then flatten even more when C19 does enter our population, as it eventually will despite all our best efforts.

As you will be fully aware the prison is different from the community and I would ask that before you instantly dismiss our idea of putting staff and prisoners in PPE to "flatten the curve in the prison" to such an extent we give the hospital capacity to manage the rest of the islands C19 patients as it hits its peak, that we have a conf call to discuss.

I fear failure to keep the prison population out of the Islands C19 peak could lead to swamping JGH ICU and also lead to avoidable deaths in the prison or wider population, as a situation in the prison that was preventable means other citizens don't get access to ICU when needed. We want to

Regime impact

- * Education and library disrupted. Gym closed but main hall and astro still in use
- * Horticulture and workshops open with reduced numbers
- * This will alter rapidly if we have high numbers of staff off. We expect if we move from absent we will have to split regimes to am and pm rotation to ration access to regime.
- * Next week moving regime to reduced numbers on association and exercise, and moving to but am at work, education. association and exercise, then rotating in the afternoon to improve control over 2m distancing as not all prisoners complying all the time.

Areas of Concern

- * We would like to move to this as the next stage of our prevent / delay plans but cannot do this due to the shortage of PPE, to ensure we don't swamp JGH ICU at a critical time in "the curve". We remain in our PREVENT AND PROTECT strategy. So far no positive C19.
- * Ready to move to PROTECT AND DELAY spread.
- * Prison setting up manufacture of cloth face masks for all prisoners and staff to slow spread and create as much of a barrier as we can being unable to create 2m at all times in a prison setting
- * Also going to manufacture surgical gowns for the hospital if we can as all PPE is in short supply.
