the offender/detainee?

Also from an infection control / spread perspective the prison is also an extremely high risk area of rapid cross infection with plus prisoners and staff living and working in very close proximity. Should Covid-19 arrive on Jersey, the prison will contain prisoners who may be positive and ill, and contagious, until they are acute and need to be transferred to the hospital. These staff - both nursing and officers staffing the unit containing Covid -19 ill prisoners, would need comparable PPE to nursing staff in HCS?

Could I have some assurance that the risk SoJPS staff may be exposed too is treated and understood in the same light as other JHA services and HCS. The issue of PPE should surely be based on risk of exposure? I raised this point at the last SCG - SoJPS officers will have a similar risk exposure to colleagues in SoJP and JCIS, and our HC team to HCS nurses.

I appreciate fully the need to control issue of PPE. My point is from the TCG action log I have now had sight of, and specifically point 35, SoJPS appears to have been omitted from consideration of appropriate PPE?



Courts

- * Now virtually all being done via video court. Thank goodness I took the decision to install 3 video courts last year!

Staffing impact

- * Staff off today out of cotal staff. Expect this to reduce over the next week as those self-isolating from leave or C19 symptoms return. Could be offset by others who need to self-isolate

- * Enficer stranded in Returning by the weekend if possible
- * others who are off for sick for existing issues or long term illness

Regime impact

- * Education and library disrupted. Gym closed but main hall and astro still in use
- Horticulture and workshops open with reduced numbers
- * This will alter rapidly if we have high numbers of staff off. We expect if we move from and pm rotation to ration access to regime.

Areas of Concern

- * We would like to move to this as the next stage of our prevent / delay plans but cannot do this due to the shortage of PPE, to ensure we don't swamp JGH ICU at a critical time in "the curve"
- * The consequence of this may be that the C19 peak of the curve in the prison corresponds with the community peak leading to swamping of ICU. We wish to do all in our means to prevent this.

* At all times we need to tread the balance of managing the C19 risk, how we may impact or not on the wider islands ability to manage C19 peak, AND maintaining operational stability in the prison. So far we are doing this

I have read the email thread and understand your concerns, however we have to manage this carefully and sensibly to ensure the provision of DDF access to advice and prioritisation of decisions is made appropriately.

and his team are doing an excellent job and are under immense pressure, as any MOH is currently due to the virus. If you have further concerns please let me know.

We discussed yesterday at the SCG the need for coordination of PPE requests, the cell HCS have set up to manage requests and we must follow that procedure. The TCG will coordinate all requests and work with the HCS cell.

The reference to cloth PPE is a way of accessing more PPE and these will be made by firms, not by your staff.

I would ask please you keep your staff in an informed place re the MOH advice, as all your staff do not need PPE and don't need to use it all the time. Other services are having similar conversations with their staff and we need to be measured in our approach. We are doing everything we can to secure more PPE.

You will no doubt continue to manage the prison as we discussed on a call yesterday to mitigate the risks and early prevention measures will assist that in increasing the distancing, longer hours in cells etc, again as we discussed.

Julian- please see the notes below and the response from To be advised to make home-made / DIY masks to prevent C19 infection for prison officers, when 20,000 face masks are now here and more coming, does not seem to address the matter seriously, nor provide a defensible position to ensure the safety and well-being of staff, or prisoners and especially if some die from C19. We must all have done what we can to prevent this and deaths amongst the wider population, that could be caused by prisoner infections impacting adversely on ICU capacity at a critical time.

I assume you understand what we are trying to achieve and its covered in the notes to Ivan below. In summary - we are trying to ensure we prevent C19 infection for as long as possible from entering the prison, and when it does to slow down the infection rate, and keep our most vulnerable prisoners from becoming unwell and blocking ICU beds at a critical peak of infection for the Island as a whole. When we now have 20,000 masks and more coming, to be told to make DIY masks does not seem to recognise this strategy nor provide the protection we need to give to our staff in SoJPS, who deal with prisoners at close proximity every day. After HCS colleagues we probably have the greatest exposure to C19 risks of any other service. We don't have the luxury of social distancing in all we do by the nature a prison. We have taken many measures to protect, distance and isolate, however appropriate PPE is now the next step to Protect, Prevent and Delay. We cant wait for C19 to become widespread in the prison

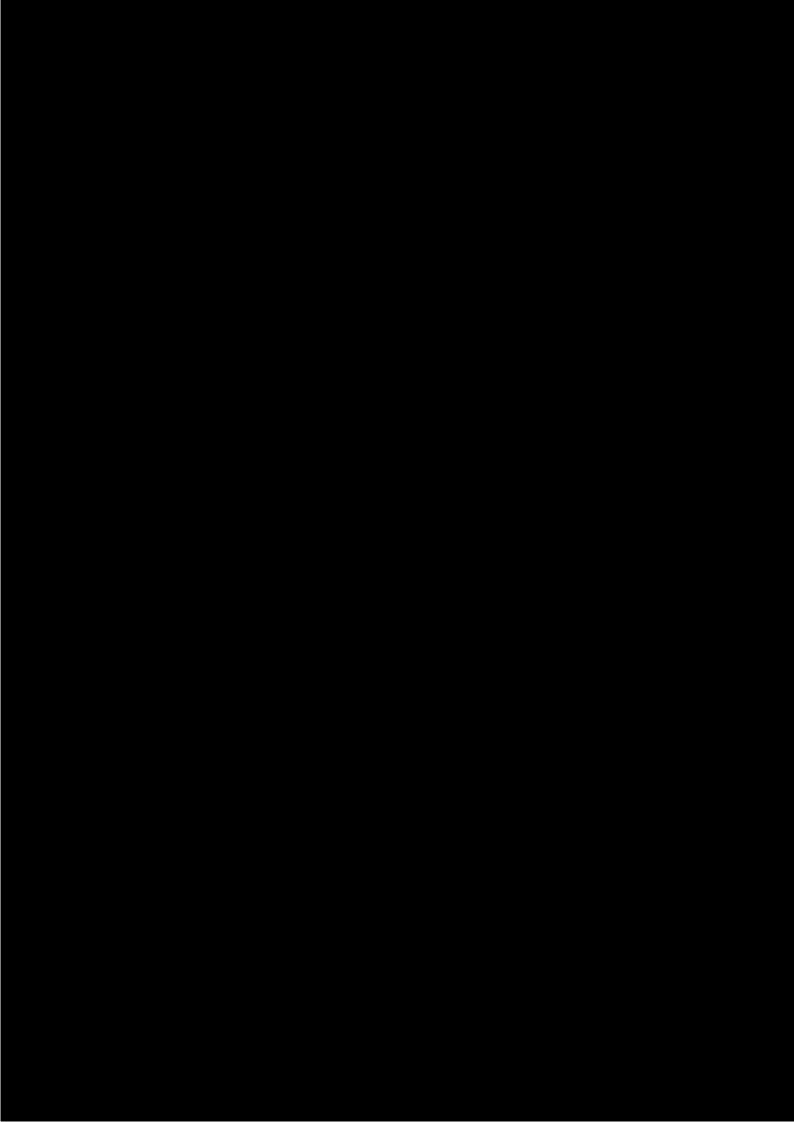


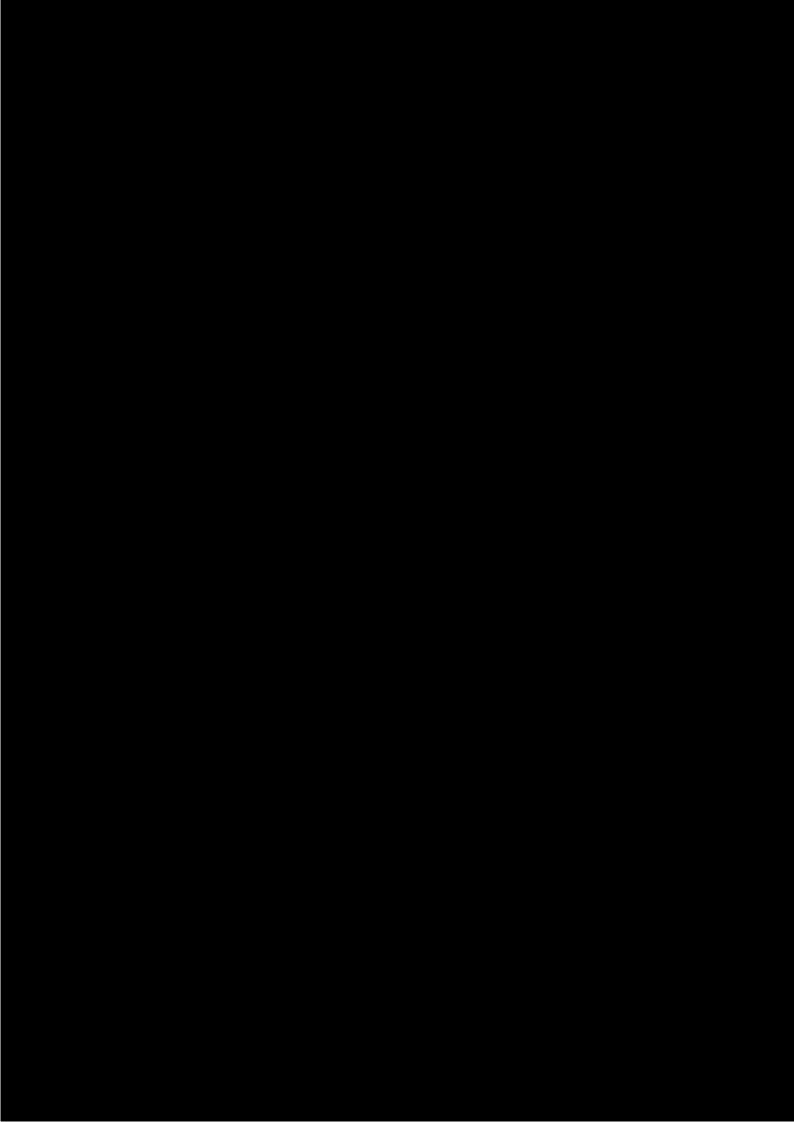
