<b>Reason(s) for Decision:</b> Following the adoption of P.71/2020 (Proposed Airport Redevelopment) and the publishing of a Terms of Reference (MD-PE-2020-0071), a request was made for individuals to present an expression of interest to the Minister for consideration. Having reviewed the relative submissions, in particular the aeronautical experience set out therein, the Minister decided to appoint Mr Graham Self as the Independent Planning Inspector
