

Highlands College - Evacuation of Disabled - Turner Block

Further to our recent meeting, I would confirm the points we discussed.

- 1. The existing use of the upper floors of the Turner building for less ambulant students must be confined to areas where adequate means of escape are available.
- 2. The north end of the building has a "dead end" situation, where students would need to escape in one direction, which is in excess of acceptable limits for able bodied people.
- 3. Your proposal to construct an escape at the north end of the building would overcome the dead end condition and could incorporate facilities for the disabled, in the form of a refuge area. This escape route should be enclosed and connect on all floors in order to provide adequate means of escape.
- 4. The two main staircases exiting between Turner and the Business School can be regarded as protected means of escape routes with adequate refuge areas for disabled. In this respect the disabled could be held at the landings whilst the remainder of the students would evacuate down the staircase and designated members of staff or appropriate students, who would wait with the disabled, could then assist them carefully down the stairs.

- 5. Your proposal to convert the flat into additional classrooms would create a similar "dead end" condition to the north and although this could be regarded as reasonable provided we avoid their use to the disabled.
- 6. The conversion of the flat should take the form of creating large open spaced classrooms with the staircase to the attic space being separated with fire resisting construction. All rooms with access into the "dead end" should also be separated with 30 minutes fire resistance including all doors which should be fitted with self closures.
- 7. During the visit it was noted that considerable storage and displays of combustible materials were found within the main circulation corridor. This route should be kept clear and free from materials which would allow rapid spread of fire throughout its length.

Re: Inspection of College Buildings

Further to Station Officer visit I can now confirm the following comments and recommendations.

Pinewood

This building has little fire resistance and poor means of escape. The radiant electric fires used for space heating are badly sited and additional firefighting equipment is needed.

A carbon dioxide extinguisher should be provided in each classroom and the heaters should be relocated away from any combustible surfaces. Exits direct to open air should be provided from classrooms.

Wren

The structure of this building is fire resistant but because of its use the fire load within is quite high. Various alterations have been carried out to divide up the interior. This has made a poor means of escape into a very bad one. To overcome the problem the existing internal staircase should be screened at the head and a new exit provided from the eastern end of the first floor. Exits from the ground floor can be created by replacing windows with doors at appropriate locations.

Fire Extinguishers

From January 1997 all new fire extinguishers will be red regardless of the contents. They will have a coloured band near the top and be suitable labelled. It is 'not' necessary to replace all existing equipment immediately. However old and new should not be mixed within one building and replacement programme should be considered. This would also be a good opportunity to review the equipment provided throughout the premises. Your insurers should be consulted in this matter.

Fire Alarm/Detection

The systems installed are considered adequate to raise the alarm for life safety. However greater building protection could be achieved by the installation of automatic detection in all areas. Older systems may need replacement or at least upgrading. As with extinguishers, a programme should be set up to achieve this.

Exit Locks

Please find enclosed details of the kind of lock which would be suitable to secure final exits out of hours.

Log Books

As promised, a number of log books are also enclosed. These will enable you to keep records of fire precautionary matters in relation to each of the buildings.

Gas



Further to the visit by one of my officers to your premises, I can now confirm the following recommendations:-

1. Fire Points

Extinguishers should be grouped together and indicated by suitable signs. All fire points should have a carbon dioxide extinguisher. If no hosereel is available then a 9 litre water or A.F.F.F. multi-purpose extinguisher should be provided. Dry powder extinguishers may be added in workshops where flammable liquids are used or welding is carried out. Sand buckets should be provided to cover liquid spillages and where metal swarf is produced. Fire points should normally be sited near exits or entrances.

2. Exits

All exit doors should be easily opened from inside without a key and be clearly indicated.

3. Fire Doors

Fire doors should be indicated as such and may only be kept open by magnets released by the fire detection system. They should close properly and provide a good seal.

4. Gas

Where mains gas is in use, a shut-off valve should be provided in a prominent position and clearly labelled. The use of gases stored in cylinders is controlled by the Health and Safety Officers of the Social Security Department. Advice in their use should be sought from that department. Please note the Fire Service should be informed immediately of any cylinder which has been involved in fire.

5. Chemicals/Fuels

Suitable cabinets or stores should be provided and liquids should not be stored above chest height. Where there is a risk of leakage, the area should be bunded. The bunding of some oil tanks needs improvement and drains should not be provided in oil fired boiler rooms.

6. Steps/Ramps

Changes of level should be overcome by ramps of 1:12 or semi public stairs as defined in B.S. 5395. Platforms are required outside exit doors to eliminate changes of level at the threshold.

7. Fire Alarm/Detection


The systems installed appear adequate to protect life and should be tested regularly. Greater protection of the buildings could be achieved by providing automatic detection in all areas.

8. The Caretaker's Flat

The location of the flat at the top of 'A' Block makes it vulnerable to any incident occurring in the building. Consideration should be given to either relocation or improved protection to the access.

This report covers only general points and questions relating to specific items should be referred to the Fire Safety Department for more detailed comment. Please find enclosed literature which I hope you will find useful.





Further to your letter of 7th February 1994 I can confirm that the fire resisting breaks as indicated on the enclosed drawings are as discussed and agreed. However, further breaks must be made between the new building and the hall of A Block.

Whatever material is used to seal any gaps it should be fire resistant. Rockwool and intumescent mastic are two common ways of doing this. This is particularly important where high risk areas (boiler room) are concerned.

NEW 'B' BLOCK, HIGHLANDS COLLEGE

I refer to a meeting between Mr and Mr and Mr on 3rd of February 1994, to discuss the above development which is presently under construction.

The Main Contractor has asked us to provide drawings showing the location of all walls designed to act as fire breaks. I have referred to your report to the Development Control Section dated 5th November 1992, file no G.41 which does not appear to require firebreak walls.

Generally, however, all blockwork walls for this building are taken up to 10mm of the underside of the suspended concrete floor slabs, and the gap taken up with 10mm flexicell, to allow for any deflection in the slabs.

Following Mr advice, I enclose two copies of our floor plan drawings nos 2928/5.6.7 and 8, one copy of which is highlighted to show walls which it is suggested should be firebreak walls.

Would you please advise if any other form of sealing apart from the flexicell, is required along the top of these walls, and also what form of sealing is required where services pass through these walls e.g. on cable trays.

HEALTH AND SAFETY AT WORK (JERSEY) LAW 1989 Highlands College, St. Saviour

Further to our recent discussions on assembly points and other fire precautionary matters associated with the main teaching block A, I would comment as follows:-

Assembly Points

- The demolition of the old temporary building block B has affected the distribution of those exiting from the building.
- 2. The present exiting arrangement facilitates routes from the east and south of the building. Due to the nature of the building works it would be difficult to maintain a single assembly point in the main car park. It appears necessary to arrange for a secondary assembly point in the road leading to the Education administration block. From this point it will be necessary to link-up with the primary assembly point.
- 3. I would not anticipate a fire situation involving the mass evacuation of all the separate buildings. In this respect the fire alarm system has been arranged to provide evacuation from the building involved in fire only. Consequently it will not be necessary to aggregate evacuation numbers for all building, this allows the two locations to be reasonable for the numbers envisaged.

General Fire Precautions

During the discussions the means of escape from the library at first floor and the north end of the second floor, was inspected. Whilst it is the intention to carry out a complete report on the college as soon as practical, my provisional thoughts are:-


- 4. The travel distance from the library to the first protected staircase could be regarded as reasonable provided an additional half hour fire resisting screen and door is constructed in the corridor. This should be positioned between the staircase and the first-aid room.
- 5. All the doors and partitions in this area should be self closing, half hour fire resisting. Some doors were noted as being fire resisting.
- 6. The travel distance from the rooms on the north end of the second floor is a greater problem. It would appear that in addition to the excessive travel distance, the partitions are either constructed or lined with a fibre board material.
- 7. The use of this area together with the compartmentation as in 4 and 5 above, needs careful consideration. It may be necessary to vacate this area or to demolish the partitions which sub-divide this area and to provide an open plan design as in the library below.
- 3. In addition to the above, I would express some concern over the amount of equipment and storage within the main artery corridor which serves as the means of escape. This should be reduced to non combustible items which will not impede exiting throughout the area by the numbers of people concerned.

Proposed Fire Precautions Subject:-

Following the inspection of some of the premises used for the Holiday Clubs, I detail below this department's recommendations.

- 1. All floor coverings to be securely fixed so as to ensure a tight fit over the whole floor area and all edges to be taped down.
- 2. Exits to open air from the parts of the school that is being used are to be unlocked prior to the arrival of children, clearly indicated and kept free from obstruction.
- 3. Corridors to be kept free of obstructions, ensuring a clear walkway and not used to store items of spare clothing, shoes, food or displays of work undertaken by the children.
- 4. Adequate containers, in size and construction, to be provided for the disposal of combustible These containers to be emptied regularly so as to prevent the contents overflowing and before the premises are closed at the end of the day.
- 5. A means to be provided of sounding the alarm if there is a need to evacuate the premises, this means should not be used for any other purpose
- 6. A means to be provided to alert the emergency services, if a mobile phone is to be used then this is to be carried on the person of whoever is in charge.
- 7. Full list of contact telephone numbers of all children to be readily available to the person who is in charge.
- 8. An assembly area identified and made known to all staff and children.
- 9. Whenever possible all activities should be confined to one level which should be the ground floor.

Fire Precautions for Education Premises

Following our meeting, I now confirm the items that were discussed.

- 1. All inspection reports will be sent to you who will be responsible for implementation.
- 2. All schools that have a fire alarm installed be connected to a central monitoring station.
- 3. Programme be established for the installation of a fire alarm in schools not covered.
- 4. Education be responsible for the supply and installation of fire related signs/notices.
- 5. A general policy be agreed for evacuation and assembly point procedures.
- 6. A procedure be introduced for the recording of visitors, including tradesmen, to all premises.
- 7. Restricted access to high risk areas, electricity cupboards, lift motor rooms etc. These areas not to be used for storage under any circumstances.
- 8. Areas that tradesmen have been working in to be checked 30 minutes after their departure.
- 9. Checks to be made to ensure persons using premises after normal hours have access to a telephone to call emergency services. (after school & holiday clubs, evening classes)
- 10. Confirmation that emergency lighting and fire alarms are tested at regular intervals.
- 11.All staff are made aware of the importance of keeping corridors, stairs and exit routes clear.

Education Premises - Hand Fire Fighting Equipment

Arising from our recent meeting on the above, I have had the opportunity to discuss matters with Mr Security, Senior Extinguisher Engineer with Securicor.

During our discussions, we covered general principles which would satisfy the Fire Service in the provision of adequate and reasonable fire fighting equipment in Educational premises.

- 1. Fire fighting points should be provided at strategic positions within the main corridors. These fire points to comprise 1 x 91 AFFF and 1 x 2kg CO² extinguishers.
- 2. In large rooms containing valuable stock (ie library, computer suite) it may be necessary to provide additional extinguishers.
- 3. All extinguishers to be mounted on wall brackets with appropriate signage.
- 4. Boiler rooms and external stores do not need extinguishers.
- 5. Where schools are refurbished, all extinguishers should conform to the European Standard EN3 (red body type) and be of the same operation.
- 6. Where existing extinguishers do not conform to the EN3 standard but are in good condition, they can be relocated to another school.

- 7. Where extinguishers are relocated or the school has adequate extinguishers not conforming to EN3, the fire points can comprise any combination of two, with water or AFFF as one type.
- 8. Special risks such as ADT Rooms need individual consideration.

The Health and Safety at Work Law places a duty to ensure a safe place of work, to achieve this in respect of hand fire fighting equipment, BS 5306 Part 3 1985 covers the selection, installation and maintenance of portable fire extinguisher.

The formation of a policy should consider the following:

- Maximum life span for extinguishers.
- Standardisation of type, number and locations, as outlined in 1 8 above.
- Maintenance arrangements.
- Experience and training of service engineers.

The British Approvals for Fire Equipment (BAFE) have very recently introduced a Registered Technicians Scheme for supply and servicing of portable fire extinguishers. This Scheme, which also covers training (with a control facility using a "Service Technicians Portfolio"), has appointed Assessors and Internal Verifiers.

Whilst the local service engineers are not currently affiliated, the Fire Service has obtained the relevant information and is considering the value of this approach.

Over the last five years the Fire Safety Department have worked towards incorporating reasonable fire safety measures during "new build" works in close liaison with your Building Projects Team.



Whilst the general guidance points cover most aspects I am inclined to feel that fire and crisis procedures should be separated since there is an element of opposite reaction i.e. "evacuate" and "stay put".

The guidance should also ensure someone contacts the Fire Service.

I have enclosed a short guide on "Fire Safety for Community Centres" which you might find helpful.

1. Fire, Emergency Evacuation and Crisis Procedures

On arrival at each site the senior staff member should contact the manager of the venue and familiarise themselves with the appropriate Fire and Emergency evacuation procedures for that site.

When he/she is clear about these he/she should ensure that the fire and emergency evacuation procedures are clearly displayed for the benefit of all staff and parents.

Parents should be informed NOT to return to the crèche in the event of an emergency evacuation but to meet up with staff and children at the designated assembly point.

The senior staff member should ensure that all staff have read and are aware of the emergency evacuation procedure.

The procedure should be practised so that staff are able to execute it with speed and precision.

In the event of a suspected crisis a prearranged code word, for example "Nipperbout Everyone", \sim could be used to alert staff to the fact that there is an emergency.

Senior staff should collect all registration cards and guard entry points to ensure no one comes in or out while staff gather the children together.

Children should be gathered into a prearranged area. Staff should ensure that all are accounted for and that numbers correspond with the registration details.

Thereafter the children must be taken out through the recommended exit and gathered outside the crèche area, being counted as they leave. Children should be escorted calmly and carefully to the evacuation assembly point. At least one staff member should lead the procession and one should remain at the rear.

One previously designated member of staff should stay behind to check all areas of the crèche including toilets and utility areas for staff and children. In the event that a child or member of staff is unaccounted for, senior centre staff and the emergency services should be informed immediately. Remain at the assembly point until instructed to leave.

If a parent returns to collect the child ask them to come with you to the fire meeting point so that you can then sign the child over. If the parent insist on taking a child get a signature. If this is impossible make sure at least two members of staff witness the child being removed. Inform security or the police as soon as possible.

A person forcing their way into a crèche, for any reason, should be impeded. Avoid physical injury. Contact security immediately and repeat the above procedure in order to minimise any risk to the children. Staying calm is vital. In extreme circumstances attempt to delay the situation and send for help.

Senior Staff, or the acting deputy, must remain in the crèche during a crisis. Send a member of staff to contact security if no telephone is available.

Unable to Locate a Child.

NEVER announce that you can not find a child.

If help is needed to locate a child use a prearranged code word or phrase.

If you hear another member of staff say these words respond immediately. Find out calmly and discreetly who is missing and where he/she was last seen.

Children should then be called for a session into the centre of the room or prearranged area. Whilst one member of staff engages the children's attention (a story or sing song are useful) other staff



Further to my recent visit to your premises I list below recommendations which, when implemented, will enhance general fire safety within the above premises. Since my visit I have studied the file on these premises and notice a previous visit by my colleague in 1996 resulted in a recommendation of improved fire separation. I am willing to discuss this point at your convenience.

- 1. The door, or partition, to the inner office being created within the reception area should be provided with a vision panel.
- 2. The fire blanket, within the canteen, should be relocated to a position remote from the stove.
- 3. A CO² extinguisher should be provided adjacent to the electrical intake room.
- 4. A fire point should be created in a central position within the workshop area. This fire point should consist of a minimum of a one 9 litre multi-purpose extinguisher; one 5kg dry powder extinguisher and one CO² extinguisher.
- 5. A further fire point located in the vicinity of the public entrance to the premises should be created and consist of one 9 litre multi-purpose extinguisher and one CO² extinguisher.
 - N.B. Both fire points should be conspicuously marked as such.

- 6. The multi-functional use to which the premises are put, together with the different processes undertaken, warrants the installation of an electric fire alarm system. A simple manual/electric system (call points plus sounders) will suffice at present. This will allow the option to include automatic detection as necessary as the business develops in the future.
- 7. The flammable substances used during the various processes (French polish, methylated spirit, printing ink, cleansers, etc.) should be stored correctly when not in use and soaked rags etc. disposed of in a suitable manner.
- 8. The current policy of smoking not being permitted throughout the premises should be maintained and endorsed by the provision of conspicuous signs to that effect.
- 9. Access to the emergency exit door at the rear of the premises must be kept clear of obstruction.
- 10. All employees must be trained in what to do in case of fire. Information on a Fire Safety Awareness Course is available in the Training and Development Opportunities Prospectus 1998 and is available from States Personnel Department. The Course is administered by the Jersey Safety Council and held at the Western Fire Station.

 - 3. Access and emergency exiting facilities for disabled
- All schools were the subject of a basic fire safety inspection in 1993 to establish any major hazard and to create a priority program for their gradual improvement. A number of reports were submitted and implemented at that time
- Our present agreed policy is to incorporate the latest fire safety measures in any building project by close liaison at the early stages of all developments





You, your colleagues and such staff as you consider appropriate, are invited to view the furnished premises between 1000 and 1400 on Thursday 31st August 2000.



My original letter to date and a dated 20th April 1998, indicated the need to remove all storage from within the basement and to contain the boiler and oil tank in separate fire resisting rooms.

Provided the above has been carried out to a reasonable standard, the installation of a kiln within a fire resisting area of the basement would also be acceptable.

It is essential that the kiln is seperated from combustible material and that it is adequately vented to open air.

I have also accepted the principle of the kiln on the basis that the basement is only used by members of staff or for the maintenance of equipment and that it is made secure.

Lighting in the basement should be by a means which cannot be turned off whilst the basement is occupied





Thank you for your letter dated 20th July 1998. Unfortunately your letter follows our receipt of a development permit as of 15th July 1998, however we have discussed the points raised in your letter with and can confirm that all, with the exception of Items 1 and 4, either have been or can be easily incorporated within our proposals. The kitchen referred to in Item 4 is an existing kitchen which in the main will remain unchanged apart from refurbishment to decorations, cupboards and equipment. The drawings presently show the blocking up of two existing doors from the kitchen, one into the garage and the other into the lobby to the female toilets, which we assume has given rise to your request for an alternative exit. We can confirm that as a result of a cost cutting exercise the conversion of the garage into changing rooms will not now take place and therefore the door entering into it from the kitchen will remain, the other into the toilet lobby, can be reinstated with suitable ironmongery.

Finally the cupboard to which you refer in Item 1 is an existing electrical cupboard that serves the top floor electrics which at this time needs to be retained. In this instance we would propose upgrading the cupboard enclosure and door to a 30/30 fire rating.

We trust our above comments have been helpful. Should you wish to discuss this matter further please do not hesitate to contact us.

- (ii) Plumb for only washing machine, hot and cold fill, complete with waste
- (iii) Provide and fit vent for tumble drier

b. Staff Toilet:

- (i) Plumb for and fit cantilevered wash hand basin, complete with taps (h & c) and waste
- (ii) Plumb for and fit two close-coupled WC's complete with wastes and overflows

c. Infant Cloaks:

- (i) Supply and plumb for three infant sized WC's, complete with wastes and overflows
- (ii) Supply and plumb for two infant sized wash hand basins, complete with taps (h & c) and wastes
- (iii) Plumb for and fit adult sized wash hand basin, complete with taps (h & c) and waste
- (iv) Supply and plumb for pressurised hot water cylinder with 3KW immersion heater

d. Main Play Room:

- (i) Plumb for and fit Belfast sink 0.6m wide by 0.4m deep, complete with taps (h & c) and waste
- (ii) Supply and plumb for stainless steel single bowl, single drainer inset sink suitable for fitment to 1000mm base unit, complete with pillar taps (h & c) and waste

e. Change Area:

- (i) Supply and plumb for udb water heater
- (ii) Supply and plumb for inset ceramic bowl complete with taps $(h\ \&\ c)$ and waste

2. Heating. Refer to Drg. No. HC/CRECHE/6, include for supplying and plumbing, but allow for possible re-use of radiators salvaged from HATC. Plumb in Acorn pipe. Supply and fit thermostatic valves to all radiators)

a. Kitchen:

- (i) Domestic oil fired boiler, sized to suit, to be sited beneath worktop
- (ii) Radiator sized to suit
- b. Reception/Corridor: radiator sized to suit
- c. Office: radiator sized to suit
- d. Staff Toilet: radiator sized to suit
- e. Quiet/Staff Room: two radiators sized to suit
- f. Main Play Room: three radiators sized to suit
- g. Store: radiator sized to keep room dry
- h. Babies Play Room: three radiators sized to suit
- i. Sleeping Room: radiator sized to suit

(Note: radiators must be low surface temperature type to prevent accidential burning)

3. Electrical Installation (refer to Drg. No. HC/CRECHE/7)

a. Kitchen:

- (i) Three high level double sockets
- (ii) One single socket beneath worktop for fridge
- (iii) One double socket beneath worktop for washing machine and tumble drier
- (iv) Cooker control unit for hob and built under oven
- (v) Supply and install hob (allow £120.00 for supply)
- (vi) Supply and install built under oven (allow £325.00 for supply)
- (vii) Supply and install time-clock, thermostat and all necessary wiring for oil fired boiler
- (viii) Single fluorescent light complete with diffuser and wall switch

b. Office:

- (i) One low level double socket
- (ii) Single fluorescent light complete with diffuser and wall switch
- (iii) Wiring and installation of telephone point

c. Staff Toilet:

- (i) Supply and install electric hand drier
- (ii) Single fluorescent light complete with diffuser and pull cord switch
- (iii) Strip light above basin

d. Reception/Corridor:

- (i) One low level single socket
- (ii) Three single fluorescent lights complete with diffusers and wall switches

e. Quiet/Staff Room:

- (i) Two low level double sockets
- (ii) One double fluorescent light complete with diffuser and wall switch
- (iii) Two wall lamps complete with switches
- (iv) Wiring and installation of TV point, to include supply and installation of suitable aerial

f. Infant Cloaks:

- (i) One double fluorescent light complete with diffuser and pull cord switch
- (ii) 13A water heater outlet for immersion heater

g. Main Play Room:

- (i) Four double fluorescent lights complete with diffusers and wall switches
- (ii) Three double sockets at 3'6" from floor level
- (iii) Wall thermostat to control central heating pump
- (iv) Wiring and installation of telephone point.

h. Babies Play Room:

- (i) One double fluorescent light complete with diffuser and wall switch
- (ii) One double socket at 3'6" from floor level
- (iii) 13A water heater outlet for udb in Change Area

i. Store:

- (i) Incandescent light fitting with wall switch
- (ii) One low level double socket
- j. Sleeping Room:
 - (i) Incandescent light fitting with dimmer wall switch
 - (ii) One double socket at 3'6" from floor level

4. General

- a. Plumbing and Heating (Pressurised Systems):
 - (i) Run mains water from T1/T2/T3 block in 35mm MDPE (blue polythene) pipe (see para 4.b.(ii) below)
 - (ii) Ensure that cold water mains to all sanitary fittings, sinks, washing machine, and other services comply with the latest Jersey New Waterworks regulations and recommendations by fitting double check valve assemblies to prevent back syphoning
 - (iii) Fit Ball-o-Fix, or similar, isolating valves to end of all supply runs
 - (iv) Lag all central heating pipes and any under floor or above ceiling cold water pipes with Armaflex insulation

b. Electrical Installation:

- (i) Run three phase mains supply from distribution board in 'E' Block
- (ii) Cable to be laid in trench from position outside T1/T2/T3 toilets to Creche. The mains water supply is also to be laid in this trench (see para 4.a.(i) above)
