First Tower School Homework Policy



Achieve, Inspire Respect

This document clarifies the procedures for home working links throughout each year group in the school. All tasks shared between school and home are intended to provide positive and supportive experiences to further develop and enrich the learning started in school and to nurture positive learning links and opportunities between home and school. Each year teachers discuss the homework for their year group with Parents and Carers at the September Meet the Teacher sessions. If at any time there are any queries about homework activities Parents and Carers are encouraged to talk to their child's Classteacher and the school through our Open Door Policy.

Foundation Stage home working links include:

Nursery:

Children are welcome to bring items of general interest or topic related from home to share with the group and this develops through into our Reception Classes.

At the beginning of Reception a booklet and other guidelines are shared to support approaches to reading.

The overall procedures for Key Stage 1, Lower Key Stage 2 and Upper Key Stage 2 are clarified overleaf.

Spelling	5-10 minutes	As children become ready, following assessment by the teacher, they will begin a simple PSP (Personalised Spelling Programme)	To link with JEL progression, starting with the first 100 words broken down into groups.
Maths Activities	15 minutes approximately	Once each week	Recorded on sheets, which will be filed in a wallet
Topic / Enrichment work	During the term children are encouraged to find out more about their topic work for science history or geography. This may include library or computer research or bringing in artefacts to share. Details of topics will be in the terms work profile letter.

Topic work	During the term children are encouraged to find out more about their topic work for science history or geography. This may include library or computer research or bringing in artefacts to share. Details will be in the term's work profile letter.		
Enrichment work	Linked to child's individual needs. Teachers may also provide reinforcement work for a child if it is part of their specific plan, e.g. to consolidate sight recognition of letter sounds or the 100 high frequency words. Parents are welcome to talk to the class teacher if they require any further guidance on how to further the learning experience at home.
