Example of how the team may work together

If you're admitted to hospital in an emergency, the:

- Ambulance service may need to respond and may need to call the Fire Service for help
- Bed Manager at the hospital may allocate you a suitable bed
- Safe Handling Team may locate suitable equipment to assist your move
- Occupational Therapy department may provide small aids to promote your independence
- Discharge Coordinator may arrange to get you home
- Patient Transport Services may transport you home
- Family Nursing & Home Care may visit you when you are home.

Reasons for an Integrated Approach

In urgent situations, different teams may work together. This approach ensures that these teams have a shared understanding of your needs and the needs of the lead agency responsible for your move.

Here are some situations where IAM may help:

- arranging for transfer to hospital
- · evacuation from an upper floor
- specialist equipment is required for your hospital stay
- additional support is required once discharged from hospital
- assistance out of a car, for example, at the hospital.

Aim of the IAM team

The IAM give a standardised, best practice approach to moving larger people. It reduces risk of injury to you and the team assisting you.

It's designed to:

- plan for your assisted move, should you need one. This
 includes a decision about whether your move is
 needed or can the services you require come to you
- provide the best care for you during your move
- ensure the lead agency responsible for your move has the correct support, advice and equipment
- Promote an agronomical approach and reduce the risk of injury

If you would like to be part of the IAM project, we need the following information:

Your name and Address - prior knowledge of any obstacles in your home, eg. stairs, lifts, narrow doorways. This is vital information should we need to move you in an emergency situation

Weight - is important from a clinical perspective, for example to calculate drug doses. It's essential to ensure the equipment we use is strong enough to transport you safely

Height - like weight it's also important. For example if you are under 5'3", there are certain hospital beds that would not be suitable for you

Body shape - knowledge of your body shape helps us to plan for your comfort

Mobility - knowledge of your mobility helps us to plan the equipment needed

This information is stored on a secure database held by Health and Social Services. It's not shared with other agencies of the IAM team unless required.
