	About Coronavirus
corona virus covid-19	Coronavirus is an illness that can make some people very unwell
	Some people who get Coronavirus do not have any symptoms This means they do not know they are ill
	Other people might have mild symptoms a new cough or one that does not go away a high temperature a headache loss of smell or taste
Rendelions	Some people will get more symptoms and feel very unwell These symptoms are: • feeling very tired • aching muscles • sore throat • diarrhoea and vomiting • fever and feeling confused





Some people who get Coronavirus can get a very serious disease in their lungs

This makes it hard for them to breathe

They will need to be in hospital for treatment



Some people can die from Coronavirus

If a person is more than 75 years old the risk is higher



There is no cure for Coronavirus


The coronavirus vaccine



A vaccine is an injection that helps protect you from getting

Coronavirus









The injection will be offered to other people at risk as soon as possible

People at higher risk of getting Coronavirus



You should have the Coronavirus injection if you are:

- an adult living or working in a care home for the elderly
- a frontline healthcare worker
- a frontline social care worker
- a carer looking after older adults in their own homes
- aged 65 years and over
- in the high risk group

Your doctor will have sent you a letter telling you that you are high risk and if you should have the injection







Please call your doctor if you:

- are in the high risk group and have not had a letter
- you think you are at a higher risk
- you are worried














The injection will be offered to young people aged 16 years old and over if they have these health conditions:

- A type of blood cancer
- Diabetes
- Dementia
- A heart problem
- A chest or breathing problem or condition
- Kidney disease
- Liver disease
- Lowered immunity from a disease or treatment
- Rheumatoid arthritis, lupus or psoriasis
- Having an organ transplant
- Having had a stroke
- A nerve or muscle wasting condition
- A severe or profound Learning Disability
- A problem with your spleen
- Being very overweight
- Having a severe mental illness

	 Side effects that are common: Having a pain in your arm for a few days where you had the injection Feeling tired Headache General aches and mild flu symptoms Side effects should last less than a week
	If you feel unwell you can take paracetamol Follow the directions on the box or ask someone to help you
	If you have a fever or are worried please call your doctor and tell them you have had the injection
	Can I catch Coronavirus from the injection?



	We do not know yet if the injection will stop you getting Coronavirus or giving it to other people It will reduce your risk of becoming very unwell

click	When it is your turn for an appointment you will be asked to book online: www.gov.je/vaccine
	You will need to answer some questions and put some of your details like you date of birth and telephone number
