Archaeology and Planning: sites of archaeological interest

BACKGROUND

The Minister for Planning and Environment has an obligation to protect sites, buildings, structures and places that have a special value or importance to the Island, including Jersey's archaeology. Archaeological remains are irreplaceable as they are evidence - for prehistoric periods, the only evidence - of the past development of our Island's civilization.

A rich variety of archaeological remains survive above and below ground in Jersey, along its shoreline, and within its waters. Some of these are familiar enough; represented by dolmens and coastal forts and castles, but less obvious archaeological remains are also to be found. Very few of these sites and areas of archaeological value have any form of protection presently.

In order to begin to protect archaeology in Jersey, it is necessary to identify, define and categorise those parts of the Island where there is known to be, or suspected of being, archaeological interest. Through their identification and definition, the potential value of these remains can then be properly considered, through the planning system, when they are affected by development proposals.

In January 2007 the Minister for Planning and Environment set out, in new supplementary planning guidance published in January 2007¹, how areas of archaeological sensitivity were to be categorised, involving the definition of 3 levels of interest - Sites of Special Interest (SSI); Archaeological Sites (AS); Areas of Archaeological Potential (AAP)

KNOWN SITES OF INTEREST

A considerable body of work has now been undertaken, on behalf of the Minister, by Jersey Heritage Trust, to identify and categorise all of the sites and areas of archaeological interest that are known to exist at the moment. Over 160 sites have been identified – ranging in size from the specific location of individual standing stones to an expansive area of St Ouen's Bay covering the remains of a Neolithic forest.

QUESTIONS TO CONSIDER

- 1) Are the proposed archaeological designations clear in meaning and extent?
- 2) Are the proposed archaeological designations comprehensive?
- 3) Do you think that there are other parts of the Island or sites that have archaeological value or interest and if so, where are they and why are they important?
- 4) Do you disagree with any of the proposed archaeological designations and if so, on what basis? (this should only be related to the archaeological value of the site(s) and not matters such as their development potential or monetary worth).
