SAFEGUARDING & CHILD PROTECTION



Face to face training to resume in Autumn 2022 – 25th November

This full day course is mandatory for those people working in registered settings. The course gives an insight into what safeguarding is and how to recognise the different areas of abuse that children and young people may be at risk from. The course also covers how to manage a disclosure, and where and who to go, if you suspect a child or young person is being abused.

JERSEY'S CHILDREN FIRST RIGHT HELP RIGHT TIME

Level 1: Introduction to Jersey's Children First (Virtual Learning Course)



This course provides a broad overview of Jersey's Children First framework. It's designed for people working primarily with adults who may be parents or carers, or whose work does not regularly involve direct contact with children and young people. The course is made up of 6 short modules which do not all need to be completed at the same time. Once you have completed all modules you can download a certificate of completion for your CPD records.

By the end of the course participants will:

- have an overview of the Jersey's Children First approach
- understand the 10 aims of Jersey's Children First
- understand everyone's responsibility to ask questions when they think a child is not okay

Level 2: Jersey's Children First Essentials (Virtual Learning Course)

This course outlines the process of supporting children and young people and their families through Jersey's Children First approach. It's suitable for everyone who works regularly with children, young people, and their families.

The course is made up of 12 short modules which do not all need to be completed at the same time. Once you have completed all modules you can download a certificate of completion for your CPD records.

By the end of the course participants will:

- understand Jersey's Children First shared values, principles and language
- understand the complex process of transition to engagement in children and families' experiences
- understand our shared qualities and what they look like in practice
- understand the 5 Questions and the Wellbeing Indicators and how these can be used to help understand when and how to provide support for a child and family
- be confident in completing Child and Family Assessments using the shared templates and tools

During the session we will look at the 2021 Statutory Framework for the EYFS alongside the Development Matters 2021 and Birth to Five Matters so that delegates will come away with a vision for the curriculum in their own setting.

- What will underpin the curriculum in your setting
- Why it is important that each setting has its own unique curriculum
- Why the curriculum must be underpinned by practice and provision that demonstrates the Characteristics of Effective Teaching and Learning and the Overarching Principles
- Why everyone, including the children and families, must be included in the development of the curriculum for you setting

- Explain the decisions behind the curriculum in their setting and how it has been developed through the Characteristics of Effective Teaching and Learning and the Overarching Principles
- Relate these decisions to the Statutory documentation, explaining how it has been incorporated
- Explain how they have involved the children and families in the development of their curriculum, how it reflects the cultural capital of all involved and how it is flexible to meet learning needs and interests

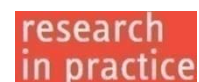
