1	Welcome/Introductions
	The members of the forum introduced themselves and the Chair reviewed the general housekeeping of the meeting so that the forum was accessible to everybody.
2	Family Nursing & Home Care (FNHC)
	The FNHC team joined the meeting to discuss falls and frailty. They discussed that common indicators of frailty include: Feeling slowed down in daily activities Muscle weakness and loss Persistent exhaustion (beyond normal tiredness) Increased need for help with personal care and household tasks Unintentional weight loss or reduced appetite Longer recovery time after illness or injury

	The FNHC team use a Clinical Frailty Scale which ranges from 1 to 9.
	 1–3: Fit and independent; able to perform daily tasks and possibly work full-time. 4–7: Mild to moderate frailty; individuals may need some assistance. This is the primary focus of the team's work.
	 Level 4: Minor support needed Level 7: Significant support required 8–9: Severe frailty; approaching or at end-of-life. Involves coordination with district nurses and hospice care.
	The FNHC team discussed steps that can help reduce your risk to frailty and falls, which included the acronym ACTIVE.
	A – Adjustment – adapt to changes

	C – Calories – healthy diet and hydration T – Thrive – support your mental well-being I - Interaction – social engagement V – Vital Signs – keep up with health checks E – Exercise regularly
	The FNHC asked the forum for feedback on how they could better engage with the community particularly those who are hard to reach. Feedback included:
	 GDPR Concerns: Isolation is exacerbated by privacy regulations, making outreach more challenging. Language Barriers: Communication difficulties arise among individuals who speak different languages. Geographical Isolation: People living in remote or rural areas face reduced access to services.

		Suggestions included involving carer agencies who regularly interact with patients and can notice when needs increase. Carers could act as valuable observers and referral sources.
		The team also received feedback from the forum on their new poster during the tea and coffee break.
Ī	3	Connect Me Directory
		At the previous meeting, a Local Services representative asked the forum what type of activities older people would be interested in joining to help with isolation and wellbeing. A member of the Connect Me team joined the forum and introduced the Connect Me Directory which is a digital platform where islanders can access information on community based activities and services aimed at improving their health and wellbeing.

	Key features include:
	 a searchable directory of social prescribed local programmes, from cultural events to physical activities and mental health support
	 flexibility to self-serve or seek assistance from a Link Worker, who can help individuals access tailored support
	 a platform that allows GPs and healthcare professionals to refer patients to social prescribing services and activities via trained Link Workers
	 stories, blogs, and videos showcasing successful community projects
	During the tea and coffee break the Connect Me team took the opportunity to interact with forum members, offering hands-on demonstrations of the Connect Me Directory. For attendees who may have limited access to the internet, the team facilitated use of the referral system, ensuring a Link

	Worker would follow up to provide personalised support and guidance by their preferred contact method.
4	Community Transport Scheme
	A representative from the Community Transport team joined the meeting to update the forum on blue badge parking and the community transport scheme.
	Mapping of 751 blue badge parking spaces has been completed across public, commercial, and government properties. 342 public spaces will be published on the Government of Jersey website this month which includes detailed info for each space including number of spots, time limits and payment requirements. Commercial spaces (e.g. shops) will not be published

	on the government site. Blue road markers are being rolled out to improve visibility and reduce abuse.
	The long-term vision of the community transport scheme is to be able to provide personalised transport. The Community Transport team is currently working on group transport and collaborative use of existing charity vehicles. Partner charities with minibuses are invited to join the scheme and charities without minibuses can request transport for events or group activities.
	Volunteer drivers are provided if charities do not have qualified drivers.
