What can Early Intervention Family Support help with?

Early Intervention Family Support Workers (EIFSWs) can provide support to:

- improve family relationships and children's behaviour
- help families and children access community resources
- help manage family finances and budgeting
- support in finding work or getting training

How does it work?

- work with your whole family
- help you identify the changes you want to make and support you to make those changes happen
- identify and build on your family's strengths
- help you access the support you need in the community
