The States of Jersey has an agreed vision for secure, affordable and sustainable energy for the Island. Pathway 2050 provides the framework for achieving this vision and is an important tool in moving to a low carbon future. Jersey has international commitments and obligations to reduce carbon emissions in line with other advanced jurisdictions.

The Energy Partnership has been formed to monitor, review and work towards a low carbon Jersey in line with the actions outlined in Pathway 2050.

The Partnership comprises two parts;

- Ministerial energy executive (the Executive),
- Multi stakeholder energy forum (the Forum).

The Energy Executive has agreed the terms of reference for both the Executive and Forum and is now looking for up to 12 stakeholder representatives to serve as members of the Jersey Energy Forum.

The Forum, with a Chair elected on an annual basis (from the Membership of the Forum), will include representatives from the energy industry, the regulator, businesses and the third sector, and will provide an opportunity for key stakeholders to input on the progress of Pathway 2050, raise areas of concern and identify changing or future priorities.

The terms of reference of the Energy Executive and Forum were confirmed at the first meeting of the Executive on 28<sup>th</sup> August 2014 and are available on [www.gov.je/Environment/GenerateEnergy/Pages/index.aspx](http://www.gov.je/Environment/GenerateEnergy/Pages/index.aspx)

These positions offer enthusiastic candidates the opportunity to play a valuable role in commenting on the development of energy policies that affect Jersey.

Members will be appointed for a period of three years and will need to attend a minimum of two meetings a year of the Forum within normal working hours, with further opportunities to contribute to the working of the Energy Partnership through officer-led project teams.
