<b>1.</b>	<b>Welcome and apologies</b>  Apologies from Ali Cambray, Ian Wilson & Chris Ambler	
<b>2.</b>	<b>Minutes and matters from last meeting</b>  The minutes were accepted as a true representation of the last meeting in February.	
<b>3.</b>	<b>Amendments that have been brought on the Sustainable Transport Policy</b>  Some members felt there was a lack of evidence for aspects of the STP and it needed to be considered as a whole.  This can be debated as part of the bus service development plan.	
<b>4.</b>	<b>Draft letter of support for the Sustainable Transport Policy</b>  The Chair had no objections.  Peter mentioned the work that the Forum has done on transport-related work in the past. The last STP failed due to lack of funding - now we have the funding and an emerging plan.	Observations about the two amendments to be added.

	<p>Concerns were raised about the removal of some general comments from the letter It was clarified that this was due to needing to gain consensus.</p> <p>It was noted that not having the opportunity to discuss things face to face made it necessary to make some decisions quickly. There was agreement we need to take a high level position as a Forum - we needed to take a letter that we have agreement.</p>	
<p><b>5.</b></p>	<p><b>Update on the Carbon Neutral Strategy</b></p> <p>Rob Ward's amendment on the 5th Principle about income inequality is being assessed. The Chair recommended supporting accepting the amendment.</p> <p>Scrutiny can observe sortition and observe the workings of the Climate Assembly.</p> <p>The SP3 team are now working on the future energy market review, fiscal levers, Citizen's Assembly, community engagement and writing the long term climate action plan. Additionally, they will conduct a review of the governance and future of the Energy Forum. Input from forum members is welcomed, as soon as possible. Building bye-laws will be a crucial aspect of this as well as engagement with politicians.</p>	
<p><b>6.</b></p>	<p><b>Communications and engagement plan for Carbon Neutral Strategy</b></p> <p>Three key aspects of the participatory democracy</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>1. Citizens' Assembly - 50 people chosen as a representative sample of the population (age, gender, ethnicity, socio-economic group). Making recommendations (not legally binding) that will go to the States Assembly for debate and will potentially form part of the Long-term carbon action plan. Partnering with a consortium that are making sure that the population are fully represented and a charity, Involve. A representative from the Energy Forum will be invited to give evidence as an expert.</li> <li>2. Online platform</li> <li>3.
