WHICH SINGLE-USE PLASTICS DO YOU USE?

BALLOONS AND PROMOTIONAL GOODS

Buy eco promotional goods and if you must use balloons make sure they are biodegradable.

GLITTER

If you do arts and crafts activities replace your glitter with biodegradable glitter.

PLASTIC BOTTLES

Plastic bottles can last for 450 years in the marine environment, they slowly fragment into smaller pieces but never truly go away. Offer refills for people with reusable bottles.





COFFEE CUPS AND LIDS

The UK uses 2.5 billion disposable coffee cups each year. Provide refillable cups and change any vending machines to take them.

PLASTIC BAGS

On average a plastic bag is used for twelve minutes. If you sell merchandise don't pop it in a plastic bag but ask people to bring their own.



PLASTIC CUTLERY AND STRAWS

Get rid of single use plastic cutlery and straws. Encourage people to carry their own and to refuse them when they are out and about.

TOP 8 THINGS YOU CAN DO

- Make a commitment to reducing the amount of plastic microfibres that comes from your uniforms, kits or other clothes that people wear as part of your community. Clothing made from man-made fibres like nylon and polyester are usually hard wearing but are made from plastic-based materials. The average fleece 1,000 and 2,000 microfibres every time it is washed. Because microfibres are so tiny, they go directly into our waterways and oceans. If you cannot swap to natural products use a special bag that catches the microfibres during the wash cycle. For example the Guppy Friend Bag. Guppfriend.com
- Screen a documentary to students, staff and/or parents. This is a link to a locallyproduced 15 minute documentary vimeo. com/256303410, and there are many more available over the internet.
- Visit the La Collette recycling plant, or the St Helier recycling depot to see the volume of waste and how it is sorted.

- Organise a trash mob! A high energy fast paced litter pick of a local beach or community space.
- Organise an evening to show everyone your community group why being plastic free matters.
- Make your events plastic free and make sure people attending know you've gone plastic free!
- Replace promotional merchandise with plastic-free 'eco' alternatives.
- When you are on trips out ask for lunches to be 'waste free' so say no to plastic bags, cling films and cartons of drinks and yes to re-usable containers and refillable bottles.





IF YOU DON'T BUY OR USE ANY SINGLE-USE PLASTICS BUT WANT TO BE INVOLVED IN PLASTIC FREE JERSEY HERE ARE 3 QUICK STEPS:

- Ban single use plastic items such as plastic bottles from being brought into your organisation.
- Get involved in plastic free initiatives and events. Including running your own.
- Be a voice for change.
 Share with others what you are doing and why it matters.
