

Brexit and EU citizens

How does the scheme work?

If you are an EU citizen living in Jersey you will need to apply to the Settlement Scheme in order to obtain your immigration permission to continue living here after Brexit.

If you have been resident in Jersey for more than 5 years you will be eligible for settled status. If you have been resident for less than 5 years you are eligible for pre-settled status.

Do I need to apply?



- If you are an EU citizen
- If you are an EU citizen and you have a family member from outside of Europe who also lives in Jersey, you both need to apply




- If you have either British or Irish nationality you don't have to apply



When should I apply?

The process for applying for settled status or pre-settled status will open from **January 2019**.



How do I apply for settled status?

From January 2019, if you are an EU citizen living in Jersey, you can apply for settled status.

The application process is easy. You will be required to fill in a short application form using a computer, tablet or smartphone. You'll simply be asked to provide some basic information.



1. Identity

You'll have to give your personal details and provide a passport or national ID card.




2. Jersey Residence

Your details will be checked against your social security data so you will need to provide your Jersey Social Security Number. You may have to provide supporting documents.



3. Criminality

You'll need to declare criminal convictions in Jersey or any other country.



4. Application Fee


5. Pre-Settled Status

You'll be granted pre-settled status if you've been living in Jersey for under 5 years.



6. Settled Status

You'll be granted settled status if you've been living in Jersey for more than 5 years.




Tomasz is Polish and has been living in Jersey for 11 years with his wife who is Hungarian. They have 1 child who holds dual Polish/Hungarian nationality.

Since Tomasz and his family have been living in Jersey for over 5 years they all qualify for settled status, subject to criminality checks.

Both Tomasz and his wife must make separate applications using the online application process. Only one of them is required to include their dependant's information.

Tomasz and his family can apply as soon as the scheme is launched. They must apply before 31st December 2020.



Carla is Portuguese and has been living in Jersey for over 40 years. Although she has children and grandchildren living in the Island who have acquired British citizenship, Carla has chosen to maintain her Portuguese nationality.

Carla qualifies for settled status, subject to criminality checks.

She can apply for settled status under the Jersey scheme once it is open. Once she has received her status she does not need to do anything further.
