A1. The Council considered the draft Comptroller and Auditor General (Jersey) Law 201-, the purpose of which was to replace and re-enact Part 6 of the Public Finances (Jersey) Law 2005, regarding the appointment, functions and powers of the Comptroller and Auditor General.

It was noted that the draft legislation incorporated the changes which had been requested by the Comptroller and Auditor General and otherwise re-enacted the provisions of the 2005 Law.

The Council accordingly approved the draft Bill and decided to lodge it ‘au Greffe’ forthwith.
