Agreed that consideration of the interaction between income support and taxation is not a priority for 20203. Agreed that taxation of cannabis is a priority4. Agreed to continue with work on stamp duty for enveloped properties5. Agree to consider work on stamp duty6. Agreed that rates and taxation of property is not a current priority7. Agreed that the concept of a “tax holiday” for PYB to CYB should not be entertained, on grounds of fairness8. Agreed to consider the impact of increases to minimum wage on tax allowances9. Concluded that compliance rates for GST on digital imports were likely to be high given the reputational impact of non-compliance. Work to be a lower priority10. Agreed that a review of probate court fees is a low priority
