St Clement Speed Limits Public Consultation



Welcome

We want Jersey's roads to be enjoyed by everyone.

Reducing the speed and number of cars helps other road users feel safe, makes the local area more desirable, and encourages people to walk and cycle. This is especially important for those travelling to and from school.

An increase in walking and cycling helps contribute to an uptake in active travel, giving wider health benefits to the people of Jersey.

Reducing the speed limit on several roads and installing modal filters on others will combine to:

- reduce rat-running
- encourage walking and cycling
- provide an extension to the routes available on the Eastern Cycle Network
- provide safer, more desirable streets in our community

Framework for Speed Limits



We want Jersey's roads to be enjoyed by everyone

Managing the speed of traffic helps other road users feel safer and encourages people to walk and cycle. This is especially important for those travelling to and from school.

Speed limits are set according to a framework that provides consistency across our Island. We are in the process of reviewing all speed limits across the Island against this framework. Details are set out below:















All residential parish roads that are not through roads will be designated as 20mph, in accordance with the framework

Please note that where the framework indicates a 40 or 30mph speed limit, a lower speed limit may be applied for road safety reasons.

St Clement Proposed Speed Limits



The proposals presented today change main roads, lanes, and residential roads in the Parish. In some areas, the changes are to connect existing paths and green lanes to a wider section of the community, thereby increasing the access to the Island's countryside. Elsewhere, lower speed limits are intended to enhance the environment for those living there.





St Clement Proposed Speed Limits



a) East St Clement


We propose to add to the Green Lane network by reducing the speed limit on La Petite Sente from 30mph to 15mph. This will link residential areas and the coast to the existing Green Lanes in the area.





b) East St Clement

We propose to reduce the speed limit on La Grande Route de St Clement from 40mph to 30mph




