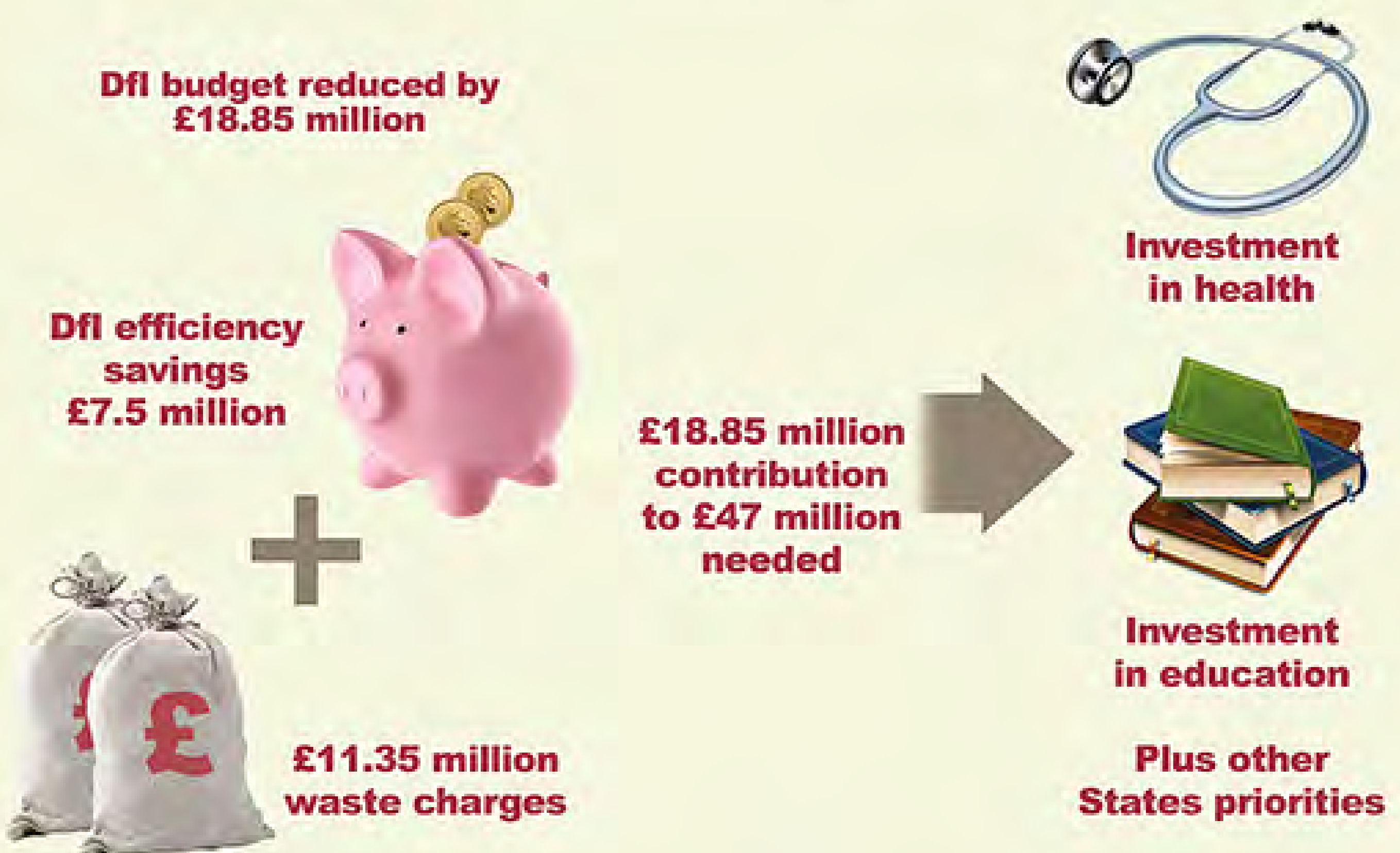


Non-householder solid and liquid waste charging

We have been asked to work on introducing solid and liquid waste charges for non-householders as part of the Medium Term Financial Plan (MTFP) that was agreed in September 2016.

Dfl was asked to make £7.5m efficiency savings across the department plus take a budget cut of £11.35m from waste services and these funds would be redirected to priority areas of new and improved services for health and education (eg mental health). Dfl could then top up its budget with £11.35m worth of non-householder waste charges. This would maintain current funding levels in waste services and there would be no reduction in services.



Non-householder waste charges, are seen as the right way to raise this much needed income because:

- They are a user pays charge and therefore fair
- They incentivise waste reduction
- They are the norm in the rest of Europe
