




Planning a Wedding in Jersey?

Getting married is a legal process that should be started as early as possible.

It's essential that you plan ahead to ensure your big day goes without a hitch.

See inside for a guide to the process of applying to get married in Jersey.



Getting married in Jersey: Legal Checklist



- 1
 - 📅 Apply to get married
 - 📅 12 months to 26 days before wedding day*
 - 📍 Online or in person
 - 💷 £200



- 2
 - 📅 Book an Authorised Civil Celebrant or Religious Official
 - 📅 As early as possible
 - 📍 Celebrant profiles and contact details online**
 - 💷 According to individual Celebrant



* Please note, both partners will need all of the following to apply:
Standard birth or adoption certificates
Valid passports
Utility bill (dated within 3 months)
Evidence of any divorce or deed poll

** If you want to marry in a Church of England venue, please contact the church directly.



- 3
 - 📅 Ensure your venue is authorised for weddings or apply to authorise a new venue
 - 📅 Before confirming your venue
 - 📍 List of authorised venues online
 - 💷 None for existing venues; £125 to authorise a venue for your wedding



- 4
 - 📅 Give Notice to Marry
 - 📅 12 months to 26 days before wedding day
 - 📍 By post or in person
 - 💷 Included in application fee



- 5
 - 📅 Apply for your Marriage Schedule
 - 📅 3 to 10 days before wedding day
 - 📍 In person. Both partners must attend
 - 💷 £300 - £550
