
Challenges: spreading happiness of Jersey

 - Social sustainability brings together the way we approach the physical fabric and the social fabric of a place



Figure 1: Better Life Index for Jersey and OECD countries; 0 (low) to 10 (high)

















Chart 6.2 - Perception of safety of the town centre after dark (percentages)




Late move to save town heritage


