1. Personal tax reform

- 1.1. The only item for discussion at the meetings held on 24 September 2019, 7 October 2019, and 29 October 2019, was the review of personal tax.
- 1.2. Those discussions included, but were not limited to, the following matters:
 - 1.2.1. The results of the various consultations that took place between October 2017 and March 2019
 - 1.2.2. The three main options for reform, and the likely financial impact of each option;

- 1.2.3. The profiles of the groups that would be affected financially by any move to independent taxation;
 - 1.2.4. The potential options for mitigating the financial impact of any move to independent taxation;
 - 1.2.5. The impact that any move to independent taxation would have on child allowances within the tax system; and
 - 1.2.6. The interaction between the tax and social security systems
- 1.3. The output from those meetings is reflected in the [report and proposition](#) (P.119/2019) lodged by the Minister for Treasury and Resources on 22 November 2019.
