



Before your travel to Jersey:

All passengers arriving in Jersey **MUST** complete a registration form before they travel.

If you haven't already, do it now.

Go to gov.je/jerseytravel



Passengers who fail to complete a form will face significant delays upon arrival.

If you can't get online, call the Helpline on **(01534) 445566**.



On arrival in Jersey

Car passengers remain in your car and follow instructions, which will depend on whether you:

Do not take a test

(14 day self-isolation)

If you do not want to be tested, you **MUST** self-isolate for 14 days.

Failure to self-isolate is a criminal offence and punishable by a fine of up to £1,000.

Take a test

This procedure will involve a swab being taken from the back of your throat and nose.

Waiting for your results

You can expect to receive your test result within 48 hours. You are not required to self-isolate while waiting for your test results but **MUST** follow Jersey's Public Health guidance.

Positive COVID-19 test results

If your test is positive, the Contact Tracing Team will call you with guidance on support available.

You **MUST** immediately self-isolate.

Negative COVID-19 test result

If your test is negative, you will receive a text message to let you know. You will be contacted by the Contact Tracing Team regularly to monitor your symptoms for up to 14 days.

Testing for COVID-19

While you're waiting for your test result

You should receive your test result in 48 hours. You won't have to isolate while waiting for your result, but you must:

- limit time away from your home or accommodation
- limit social contact with others
- adhere to one metre physical distancing
- avoid public transport, where possible
- avoid indoor gatherings, including bars and restaurants, where possible
- follow good hand and respiratory hygiene and remain vigilant for any known symptoms.

After testing

We will text your registered number every day for the next 14 days. You must reply with the word 'WELL' to confirm that you don't have COVID-19 symptoms.

If you or anyone else in your household develops symptoms, you must immediately self-isolate and reply to the message with 'COVID'. A member of the Contact Tracing Team will then call you to discuss support and next steps.

If you do not respond to the text messages, a member of the Contact Tracing Team will phone you to check that you are well. If we don't get a response, Honorary Police officers will visit your place of residency to check on your welfare. If contact with you can still not be made, this will be escalated to the States of Jersey Police for possible enforcement action.

If you can't reply to the daily text messages because of your phone operator's network restrictions, please instead email monitoringcovid@gov.je with your full name and response.

If you have not heard the results of your test after 48 hours, please call the Helpline on **(01534) 445566**.

If your test result is negative

If your test result is negative, you'll receive a text message to let you know.

If you subsequently develop symptoms of COVID-19, you should self-isolate and contact the Helpline on **(01534) 445566**, so that they can provide you with the appropriate support and next steps.

You must continue replying to the daily text messages.

If your test result is positive

If your test result is positive, our Contact Tracing Team will call you with advice about what to do and the support available to you.

You must immediately self-isolate and provide the Contact Tracing Team with details of who you have come into close contact with in the days prior.

If you are a non-Jersey resident and do not have access to a suitable location to self-isolate, please call the Helpline on **(01534) 445566**.

While isolating, the Contact Tracing Team will regularly contact you to monitor your symptoms and ensure that you are complying with all restrictions. Failure to self-isolate is a criminal offence and punishable by a fine of up to £1,000.

Remain vigilant about your health. If you become ill or think you may have symptoms of COVID-19, you must self-isolate and contact the Helpline on **(01534) 445566**.
