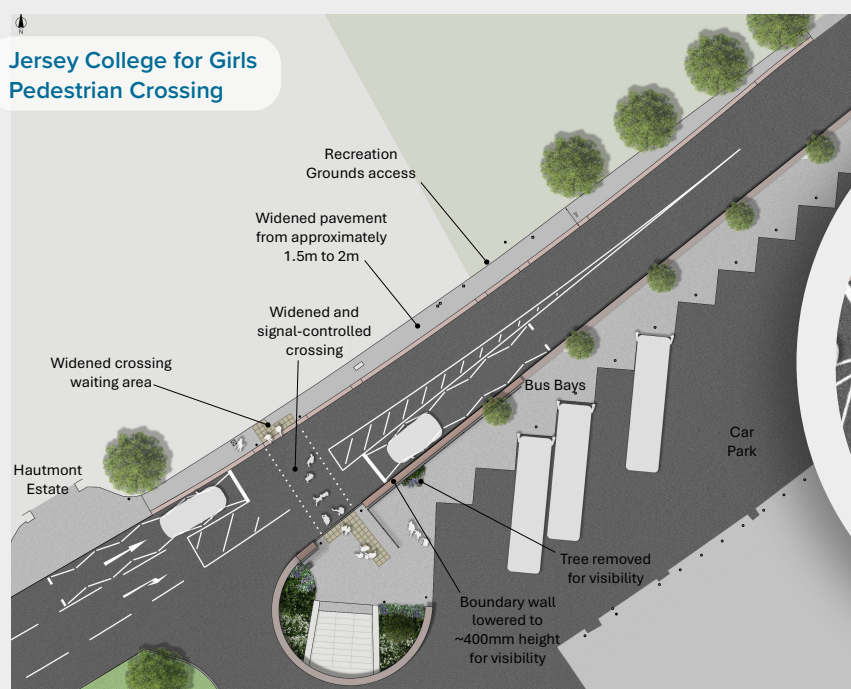

JERSEY COLLEGE FOR GIRLS CROSSING UPGRADE

To provide safer routes for children and adults walking to school, the Government of Jersey are proposing to upgrade an existing pedestrian refuge on Le Mont Millais adjacent to Jersey College for Girls to a signal-controlled crossing. The upgraded crossing will provide safer access to bus services which start and terminate in the Jersey College for Girls bus park.

PROPOSED CHANGES

The proposed changes are outlined in the plan below and include widened footways and changes to the school boundary wall to improve visibility of the signalised crossing. A photomontage of the scheme is also shown at the bottom of this leaflet.



SCHEME BENEFITS

The scheme will enable more walking to school by providing a safer crossing and reducing reliance on private cars. Scheme impacts will be monitored after delivery.

NEXT STEPS

The scheme is planned for construction in summer 2025 and should be in place before the start of the 2025/26 school year in September.
