Jersey's private sector gas workers should be treated the same as those employed by the state-owned utilities during the coronavirus emergency, Unite the union, urged today (Monday 6 April).

Unite has lent its weight to the campaign for workers at Jersey Gas and Kosangas Jersey to be elig ble for the Phase 2 payroll co-funding scheme – the Channel Island's equivalent of the UK 's coronavirus job retention scheme which guarantees furloughed workers 80 per cent of income. Jersey Electricity and Jersey Water are owned by the States of Jersey Government, so these workers already receive state support, while privately-owned utilities, currently, don't have access to the scheme.

Unite regional coordinating officer Terry Keefe said: "Unite is lending its support to the gas companies in their bid to qualify for the Phase 2 payroll. They provide services to about half Jersey's businesses, including hotels and restaurants now closed, and are really under the financial cosh.

"The States government quickly needs to embrace private utility companies in Phase 2 for cash flow reasons to keep them afloat, otherwise our

members could find themselves in desperate financial hardship.

"The future provision of gas by a highly skilled workforce will also be under threat.

"This is not the time for the States of Jersey Government to engage in short-termism – we need to retain the gas workers as they will be a vital cog in rebuilding the post-pandemic economy."

Unite has about 60 gas worker members on Jersey.

Whilst we need to see what he sends through, from what he says on the phone they do appear to be suffering significant detriment. They have 46 staff on the island, many of whom are effectively stood down at present as they are unable to carry out their standard engineering roles at present. If they are laid off to preserve the business this risks their future ability to operate as those engineers may be picked up by other industries with similar training needs / skillsets.

A high proportion of their business is commercial, including hospitality (hotels and restaurants). The impacts of home working and non-essential business closures have had a material impact on their business.

Clearly Jersey Gas are part of the Island's critical infrastructure. They must continue providing their service.

Big businesses and many households will depend on those details, so no pressure then. Chamber has been engaging with – that's lots of talking – with businesses big and small and with those in Government to make them as aware as they can be of the difficulties that exist. A fair amount of credit has to go to the handful of politicians in the frontline of the economy and the officers working through to deliver for as many as they can – and have me in their ear several times a day. Yesterday and today, we took up the concerns of Ferryspeed and Jersey Gas and many others, along with accountants, recruitment firms, architects, estate agents, school suppliers, local food producers, aviation companies and many more. Let's hope the questions, chats and wait has been worth it. Tomorrow then.

Finally, in this section the Employment and Skills Committee met today and discussed – well, employment and skills, both now and in the future. The overriding theme was 'this is about people' and looking after your people is paramount. Talk to them, help them where you can and mostly check and care about their wellbeing. If they are working remotely or just off, make sure you check on them and how they are coping.

I spoke to Ian Plenderleith again last night, just before he went into a meeting with his shareholders.

So, we are in live conversations with Jersey Gas reference their exact needs and have told them that in order to progress their request we require full details of their financial position, including broader IEG information, details of their debt structure (is their debt internal or external) and clarity on exactly what their proposal for support includes. Once we have this we can make an assessment of their situation and provide some water-tight advice with a recommendation as to whether their case should be submitted to the Special Situations Fund. We are still awaiting some of this information, which I am chasing today.

I would suggest that until we have received the necessary data and completed our assessment we should hold-fire on a meeting, but send a holding response along the lines of thanking them for their letter and that the Minister understands their concerns and the urgency of the situation, but that he is aware of and pleased that Jersey Gas and officers are undertaking a financial needs assessment and that he will be happy to discuss the situation once the necessary due diligence has been completed.

I would concur. Our objective needs to be to ensure that as many viable businesses survive to emerge the other side of the crisis, as well equipped as poss ble to take advantage of immediate market opportunities.

I suspect that viable businesses can only survive on interventions and reserves for a limited period of time. Indeed, they may decide to close in spite of viability, as it is a high-risk policy to continue to run reserves down to borderline going concern levels or to take on significant debt, whilst there is uncertainty in what the new normal trading environment might look I ke going forward and in the absence of clarity around the type of stimulus and incentives that the Govt might put in place to assist the recovery.

Jersey Business are in a good place to provide us with the data and feedback that helps us understand the needs of SMEs in more granular detail



Finally, can I just thank and his team for the outstanding contribution that they have made to our collective economic response. They have been at the sharp end which must be very draining emotionally and really long and hard yards. We must make sure we fully utilise the experience, business intelligence and foresight gained by JBL in the front line, to inform evidence based economic policy going forward.

Requests for financial information have been made by officers initially with aim of assessing potential detriment under the Payroll Co-Funding Scheme, but once those scheme rules were published with the exclusion of all utility companies, the conversation moved to understanding the wider financial position of the Jersey Gas / IEG structure in order to consider whether it may be appropriate to provide funding under the Special Situation / Recovery Fund or equivalent.

From the conversations with lan this evening, it is clear that there are 3 key elements impacting on Jersey Gas, only one of which relates to payroll,

So we need, I think, to

take a proper strategic view of the business to address both the short, medium and long-term considerations facing Jersey Gas, rather than simply trying to address one co-funded payroll element.

It is also important for Jersey Gas to explain what measures their shareholders are taking to address the current issues and what conversations they have had with their bankers, to ensure that tour support of last resort and that the burden to the taxpayer is a low as is possible. Jersey Gas have this evening committed to provide this information by the end of the week and are comfortable working within the timescales we have discussed with them. As such, I would respectfully ask you to defer your Proposition to allow us time to do the necessary due diligence to ensure we find the right sustainable, long-term solution.
