EDUCATION (DISCRETIONARY GRANTS – AMOUNTS) (AMENDMENT) (No. 7) (JERSEY) ORDER 2015

Coming into force

THE MINISTER FOR EDUCATION, SPORT AND CULTURE, in pursuance of Articles 51 and 68 of the Education (Jersey) Law 1999, orders as follows –

1 Amendment of Education (Discretionary Grants – Amounts) (Jersey) Order 2008

After Article 4 of the Education (Discretionary Grants – Amounts) (Jersey) Order 2008 there is inserted the following Article –

“4A Limits on course fees

- (1) In this Article –
 - ‘clinical year’ means a year that –
 - (a) forms part of a course in medicine, dentistry, veterinary science, or a related subject; and
 - (b) includes a period of study by way of clinical training;
 - ‘fee element’ means the amount that may be taken into account as course fees for the purpose of Article 7 of the General Grants Order;
 - ‘non-clinical year’ means a year that is not a clinical year.
- (2) For a non-clinical year, the fee element is limited to £9,000.
- (3) For a clinical year of a course falling within paragraph (5), the fee element is limited to such amount, being not less than £9,000, as the Minister considers appropriate.
- (4) For a clinical year of a course not falling within paragraph (5), the fee element is not limited.
- (5) A course falls within this paragraph if –

- (a) at least one clinical year and at least one non-clinical year form part of the course;
- (b) the fee element for a non-clinical year of the course would (but for the operation of paragraph (2)) exceed £9,000; and
- (c) the fee element for a clinical year of the course would (but for the operation of paragraph (3)) exceed £9,000 by an amount that appears disproportionate to the Minister in relation to any other course.”.

2 Citation and commencement

This Order may be cited as the Education (Discretionary Grants – Amounts) (Amendment No. 7) (Jersey) Order 2015 and comes into force on 1st September 2015.
