DRAFT WASTE MANAGEMENT (JERSEY) LAW 2005 (APPOINTED DAY) ACT 200-

REPORT

In order to bring into force the Waste Management (Jersey) Law 2005 in a form that will allow DEFRA to seek extension of the Basel Convention to Jersey it is necessary to also enact and bring into force the Waste Management (Jersey) Law 2005 (Appointed Day Act) 2006. The extension of the Basel Convention is required before Jersey is able to resume the export of hazardous waste for treatment or disposal.

There are no financial or manpower implications for the States arising from this Draft Act.

- (a) the machinery provisions, for example those providing for applications for waste management licences, the issue of such licences and the registration of carriers, would come into force on 1st November 2006; and
- (b) the coercive provisions, such as those prohibiting unlicensed waste operations and unauthorized movements of consignments of waste, would come into force 3 months later, i.e. on 1st February 2007.

THE STATES, in pursuance of Article 113 of the Waste Management (Jersey) Law 2005, have made the following Act –

1 Commencement of the Waste Management (Jersey) Law 2005

- (1) The Waste Management (Jersey) Law 2005¹ (other than the provisions specified in paragraph (2)) shall come into force on 1st November 2006.
- (2) Articles 23, 38 and 49, Part 4, Articles 86, 87, 88, 89, 90, 91, 92 and 112 (as far as it relates to Schedule 11) and paragraphs 3, 13 and 14 of Schedule 11 of the Waste Management (Jersey) Law 2005 shall come into force on 1st February 2007.
