Summary of the site

The building scheduled in this report is of inadequate historical, architectural or other interests and does not satisfy the published criteria for Listing.

Late C19; renovated and altered late C20.

3 bay, 2 storey house with garage extension to the north and cottage at right angles to the frontage. Broadwood: Front (west) elevation: Slate roof, brick chimneys. Stucco, ashlar effect. All windows are 6 pane (3/3) sashes, the side panes being narrower. Door at centre is new, single pane overlight. Stone boundary wall with brick coping. Broadwood Cottage: Front (south) elevation: Taken over by ironwork workshop. Rear (north) elevation: 3 bays. Pantile roof. Stucco, ashlar effect. Windows are all 4 pane (2/2) sashes. Side (west) elevation: Gable end wall. Stucco, ashlar effect. New door.

Advice offered by MLAG (and others if stated)

MLAG discussed the grading of this building at their meeting on 16/04/2012. Members recommended that the building scheduled in this report should be listed as grade 4, for its streetscape value.

Jersey Heritage recommendation

De-list. A typical late 19th century house, renovated and altered in late C20. The original single storey entrance wing has been rebuilt as a garage. The original outbuilding wing has lost its gable end carriage entrance and loading door. There is otherwise insufficient interest to justify listing.
