## Recommendation

To approve the waiver of 50% of the standard application fee in this specific case.

## Detail

A planning application (P/2021/1751) for works to convert The Hampshire Hotel into residential units for the charity Les Amis is being offered a 50% reduction on the fee paid. This amounts to a refund £1725.40. At the time of registration, the applicant did not request a fee waiver from the Minister. However, the Minister, taking into account the fee due for all elements of the application, the "not for profit" work of Les Amis, and the benefit of their work to the Island, considered that a refund of 50% of the standard application fee should be given in this specific case.
