

Law Drafting Instructions: Order under Regulation 5 of the Regulation of Care (Regulated Activities) (Amendment of Law) (Jersey) Regulations 2022

1. Introduction

- 1.1 Law drafting is required for an Order to bring the following Regulations into force, including the amendments to the 2018 Order requested below, from 1 January 2023:
 - [Regulation of Care \(Regulated Activities\) \(Amendment of Law\) \(Jersey\) Regulations 2022](#);
 - [Regulation of Care \(Standards and Requirements\) \(Amendment\) \(Jersey\) Regulations 2022](#); and
 - [Regulation of Care \(Transitional Provisions\) \(Jersey\) Regulations 2022](#).
- 1.2 These amendments are necessary to implement the changes to the Regulation of Care (Jersey) Law 2014 (the “2014 Law”) which were approved by the States Assembly on 25 April 2022 when it adopted the [Regulation of Care \(Regulated Activities\) \(Amendment of Law\) \(Jersey\) Regulations 2022](#) (the “2022 Regulations”).
- 1.3 The 2022 Regulations will, when they are brought into force, amend Schedule 1 to the 2014 Law to include the following regulated activities under the regulatory ambit of the Jersey Care Commission (JCC):
 - adoption services;
 - children’s home services;
 - fostering services;
 - social work services for children and young people;
 - independent monitoring and review services in looked after children’s cases;
 - child contact centres;
 - residential family centres;
 - children and young peoples’ mental health services;
 - care services in special schools; and
 - children and family community nursing services.

2. Order to Commence the 2022 Regulations

- 2.1 The LDO are requested to draft an Order under Regulation 5 of the 2022 Regulations to bring the Regulations into force from 1 January 2023. This Order would also bring the Regulation of Care (Standards and Requirements) (Amendment) (Jersey) Regulations 2022 (under Regulation 37) and the Regulation of Care (Transitional Provisions) (Jersey) Regulations 2022 (under Regulation 5).
