## Detail

Following two third-party appeals against the grant of planning permission at Mailmate Ltd, Le Quai Bisson, St Brelade (P/2024/0728), Nigel McGurk was appointed as the independent planning inspector to consider the appeal, including all plans and documentation associated with it.

The inspector visited the site and surroundings before holding a hearing and, subsequently, preparing and submitting a report for the Minister's consideration.

The Minister has given full consideration to the inspector's report and to the material factors referred to in it.

## Decision

The Minister decided to dismiss the appeals, and that planning permission should be granted, in accord with the inspector's recommendation.
