MOTOR TRAFFIC (THIRD-PARTY INSURANCE) (EXPENSES LIMITS) (AMENDMENT) (JERSEY) ORDER 2013

Made

Coming into force

THE MINISTER FOR HEALTH AND SOCIAL SERVICES, in pursuance of Article 3(2B) of the Motor Traffic (Third-Party Insurance) (Jersey) Law 1948, and after consultation with the Minister for Transport and Technical Services, orders as follows –

1 Interpretation

In this Order, “principal Order” means the Motor Traffic (Third-Party Insurance) (Expenses Limits) (Jersey) Order 2013.

2 Article 2 substituted

For Article 2 of the principal Order there shall be substituted the following Article –

“2 Maximum amounts

- (1) The maximum amount of expenses for each occasion on which, as a result of his or her injury, an injured person is provided with ambulance services for the purposes of taking him or her to a hospital for HSS treatment is the amount specified in column 2 of the table in the Schedule, opposite the period in column 1 within which the injury occurred.
- (2) Where the injured person is treated in a hospital for his or her injury without being admitted to the hospital for such treatment, the maximum amount of expenses for HSS treatment of the injured person is the amount specified in column 3 of the table in the Schedule, opposite the period in column 1 within which the injury occurred.
- (3) Where the injured person is admitted to a hospital for treatment for his or her injury, the maximum amount of expenses for HSS

treatment of the injured person is, for each day or part of a day of admission, the amount specified in column 4 of the table in the Schedule, opposite the period in column 1 within which the injury occurred.

- (4) The aggregate amount of expenses for HSS treatment and ambulance services provided to an injured person in respect of the person's bodily injury arising out of the use of a motor vehicle on a road shall not exceed the amount specified in column 5 of the table in the Schedule, opposite the period in column 1 within which the injury occurred.
- (5) For the purposes of paragraph (1), the reference to taking a person to a hospital includes taking the person from one hospital to another.
- (6) For the purposes of paragraph (3), where the injured person was admitted to hospital on one day and discharged on another day, the day of discharge shall not be counted as a day of admission."

3 Schedule added

The following Schedule shall be added to the principal Order –

4 Citation and commencement

This Order may be cited as the Motor Traffic (Third-Party Insurance) (Expenses Limits) (Amendment) (Jersey) Order 2013 and shall come into force on 1st April 2013.
