

Misuse of Drugs (Jersey) Law 1978 Misuse of Drugs (Addicts) (Jersey) Order 1980

Licence to Administer, Supply, or Authorize the Administration or supply of, a Controlled Drug to an Addict

In pursuance of the Misuse of Drugs (Jersey) Law 1978 ("the Law"), and the Misuse of Drugs (Addicts) (Jersey) Order 1980 ("the Order") made under the Law, the Minister for Health and Social Services hereby grants the following individual a licence to administer, supply, or authorize the administration or supply of, a controlled drug identified within the Order to an addict as defined within the Order.

General Licence Conditions

- 1. The licence will be for a limited one-year period only.
- 2. The licence, unless sooner revoked, shall on expiry be surrendered to the Minister.
- 3. A new licence will be required to administer or supply, or authorize the administration or supply of, a controlled drug on the expiration of this licence.
- 4. All controlled drugs must be prescribed in line with agreed policies including, but not limited to, the Orange Book⁴ and relevant NICE guidance, and in line with all professional responsibilities, such as those required by the General Medical Council (GMC).
- 5. This licence is not transferable to another prescriber or another premises.
- 6. Drugs can only be supplied or administered to patients with an established diagnosis of opioid dependency.
- 7. Full records of the controlled drugs prescribed must be kept and a copy of all prescriptions provided to the Chief Pharmacist.
- 8. By requesting a licence, the named clinician confirms that they understand the requirements of the relevant Law and Order.
- The licence is valid only for the licensee and may be revoked at any time by the Minister for Health and Social Services and shall in that event be immediately surrendered to the Minister. It shall be produced for inspection when required by any person duly authorised under the said Law.
- 10. The licence is only valid for the purposes of delivering medical care on behalf of a Government of Jersey department, in particular Health and Community Services and Justice and Home Affairs.
