Vehicle Make and Registration: Mercedes-Benz B-Class GL06 OCZ

The vehicle, having been used to import heroin into Jersey on 07 September 2019, was seized on 12 June 2023 under <u>Article 54</u> of the Customs and Excise (Jersey) Law, 1999.

The vehicle is 18 years old, in poor condition, with no MOT, so the likelihood of recovering any costs associated with registering in Jersey and selling on is low.

Recommendation

The Minister is recommended to approve the disposal of vehicle under <u>Article 55</u> of the Customs and Excise (Jersey) Law, 1999 which empowers the Minister to direct how any vehicle condemned as forfeited is disposed of.
