Vehicle Make and Registration: Vauxhall Astra – EN11 AXF

The vehicle, having been used to import controlled drugs into Jersey on 12th October 2019, was seized on 21st October 2024 under [Article 54](#) of the Customs and Excise (Jersey) Law, 1999.

The vehicle is 14 years old, in poor condition, with no MOT, so the likelihood of recovering any costs associated with registering in Jersey, and selling on, is low.

Recommendation

The Minister is recommended to approve the disposal of vehicle under [Article 55](#) of the Customs and Excise (Jersey) Law, 1999 which empowers the Minister to direct how any vehicle condemned as forfeited is disposed of.
