TOWN CRITERIUM (JERSEY) ORDER 2013

Made

Coming into force

THE MINISTER FOR TRANSPORT AND TECHNICAL SERVICES, in pursuance of Article 2 of the Entertainments on Public Roads (Jersey) Law 1985, on the application of Jersey Cycling, and after consultation with the Connétable of St. Helier, orders as follows –

1 Interpretation

In this Order -

"entertainment" means the entertainment in the form of a cycle race known as the Town Criterium;

"Law" means the Entertainments on Public Roads (Jersey) Law 1985;

"promoter" means the promoter referred to in Article 2.

2 Promoter

For the purposes of this Order, Jersey Cycling is the promoter.

3 Use of roads for entertainment

- (1) If the requirements as to insurance and public notice set out in Articles 7 and 8 are complied with, any public road (or part of a public road) specified in paragraph (3) may be used during the period specified in paragraph (2) for the following purposes
 - (a) the holding of the entertainment;
 - (b) the viewing of the entertainment;
 - (c) the making of arrangements preparatory to the holding and viewing of the entertainment.

(2) That period is –

(a) in the case of the part of The Parade specified in paragraph (3)(d), the period between 10 a.m. and 6.30 p.m. on Sunday 26th May 2013; or

- (b) in the case of any other public road (or part of a public road) specified in paragraph (3), the period between 11.45 a.m. and 6.15 p.m. on Sunday 26th May 2013.
- (3) The public roads (or parts of public roads) are the following
 - (a) York Street;
 - (b) The Parade from its junction with York Street to its junction with Gloucester Street;
 - (c) Union Street;
 - (d) that part of The Parade that lies to the east of the Parade Gardens and runs from a junction with Union Street to a junction with Cannon Street;
 - (e) Burrard Street from its junction with Union Street and New Street to its junction with Halkett Place;
 - (f) Halkett Place from its junction with Burrard Street to its junction with Hill Street;
 - (g) Hill Street from its junction with Halkett Place to its junction with Mulcaster Street and Church Street;
 - (h) Mulcaster Street;
 - (i) Weighbridge Place;
 - (j) The Esplanade from its junction with Weighbridge Place to its junction with Conway Street;
 - (k) Conway Street;
 - (1) Broad Street;
 - (m) Charing Cross.

4 Road closures

During the period when a public road (or part of a public road) specified in Article 3(3) may be used for any of the purposes specified in Article 3(1), the promoter may cause it to be closed to traffic.

5 Material required for entertainment

During the period when a public road (or part of a public road) specified in Article 3(3) may be used for any of the purposes specified in Article 3(1), the promoter may cause to be placed on the road (or part) material required for the purposes of or in connection with the entertainment.

6 Other arrangements for safety of public, or purposes incidental to entertainment

- (1) The arrangements set out in this Article also apply for the purposes of the entertainment.
- (2) Notwithstanding Article 3(1) of the Road Traffic (St. Helier) (Jersey) Order 1996 or Part 1 of Schedule 1 to that Order, between 11.45 a.m. and

6.15 p.m. on Sunday 26th May 2013 any vehicle may be driven in either direction on the following roads or parts of roads –

- (a) Commercial Street;
- (b) Devonshire Place from its junction with Lemprière Street to its junction with Great Union Road;
- (c) Le Geyt Street;
- (d) Lemprière Street;
- (e) New Street from its junction with Library Place to its junction with Duhamel Street;
- (f) Seale Street.
- (3) Notwithstanding Article 3(1) of the Road Traffic (St. Helier) (Jersey) Order 1996 or Part 1 of Schedule 1 to that Order, between 11.45 a.m. and 6.15 p.m. on Sunday 26th May 2013
 - (a) in Cattle Street, a vehicle may be driven only northwards; and
 - (b) in Duhamel Place, between Don Street and Grove Street, a vehicle may be driven only northwards.
- (4) Notwithstanding any other enactment, between 8 a.m. and 6.15 p.m. on Sunday 26th May 2013, a vehicle must not remain on either side of any public road (or part of a public road) that is specified in Article 3(3), except with the permission of the promoter, a police officer, or a person appointed by the promoter as an event marshal.
- (5) Notwithstanding anything in Article 6(1), Part 3, or Part 4, of the Road Traffic (St. Helier) (Jersey) Order 1996, a vehicle must not remain
 - (a) on either side of Cattle Street, between 8 a.m. and 6.15 p.m. on Sunday 26th May 2013; or
 - (b) on either side of The Parade from its junction with Union Street to its junction with Cannon Street, between 2 p.m. on Saturday 25th May and 7 p.m. on Sunday 26th May 2013.

7 Insurance cover

The requirements of this Article to which Article 3(1) refers are that the promoter must produce to the Minister, not later than Friday 17th May 2013, evidence that there is insurance (to the satisfaction of the Minister) against any liability that may be incurred by –

- (a) any person organizing, supervising, or concerned in the conduct of, the entertainment;
- (b) the promoter;
- (c) any official, agent or servant of the promoter;
- (d) any person taking part in the entertainment,

in respect of damage to property, or in respect of the death of any person or bodily injury to any person, resulting from the holding or viewing of the entertainment or from any of the preparations for the entertainment.

8 Public notice of restrictions

- (1) The requirements of this Article to which Article 3(1) refers are as set out in paragraphs (2) and (3).
- (2) On 2 occasions during the 9 days immediately preceding Sunday 26th May 2013, the promoter must cause to be published in the Jersey Gazette a notice of
 - (a) each proposed closure, under Article 4, of a public road; and
 - (b) each arrangement that will apply under Article 6,
 - specifying the roads and periods concerned.
- (3) Each notice is to be certified by the Greffier of the States as a notice that is being published in pursuance of this Order.

9 Limited access

- (1) Nothing in this Order prevents a pedestrian from using a footpath adjacent to a public road (or part of a public road) that is closed under this Order.
- (2) However, a pedestrian must not cross any public road (or part of a public road) when it is closed under this Order unless the pedestrian does so at a point, and at a time, designated by the promoter, a police officer, or a person appointed by the promoter as an event marshal.
- (3) Despite this Order, a police officer, or a person appointed by the promoter as an event marshal, may allow such access as is reasonably required for vehicles to any premises that are situated on or adjacent to any public road (or part of a public road) that is closed under this Order.

This Order may be cited as the Town Criterium (Jersey) Order 2013.
